ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 339

DIGEST OF SB 339 (Updated March 2, 2016 4:42 pm - DI 107)

Citations Affected: IC 4-31; IC 4-33; IC 31-25; noncode.

Synopsis: Daily fantasy sports. Provides that a paid fantasy sports game does not constitute gaming for any purpose. Provides that paid fantasy sports games may be conducted through an Internet web site maintained and operated by a game operator or on the premises of certain licensed facilities under a contract between a game operator and the owner of the licensed facility. Provides for the regulation of paid fantasy sports games by the paid fantasy sports division of the gaming commission (division). Provides that the division has certain powers and duties for purposes of administering, regulating, and enforcing paid fantasy sports. Provides that an individual must be at least 18 years of age to participate in a paid fantasy sports game. Provides that any prize

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awarded in a paid fantasy sports game must be made known before the paid fantasy sports game begins. Requires a game operator to implement certain procedures concerning: (1) preventing certain individuals from competing in paid fantasy sports games; (2) verifying that a game participant is at least 18 years of age; (3) allowing individuals to restrict themselves from entering paid fantasy sports games; and (4) disclosing the number of paid fantasy sports games a single game participant may enter. Establishes the fantasy sports regulation and administration fund. Provides that fees and civil penalties under the fantasy sports regulation provisions must be deposited in the fantasy sports regulation and administration fund. Appropriates money in the fund for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017. Provides that: (1) the game operator initial fee is at least \$50,000, but may be increased up to \$75,000 if the division increases the fee to cover the costs of the operation of the division; and (2) the annual fee for a game operator is \$5,000. Provides that a licensee's license is contingent upon the determination by the division that the licensee is in compliance with the statute. Requires a licensee to be investigated every three years to determine compliance. Provides that a licensee shall bear the cost of investigations. Provides that a "paid fantasy sports game": (1) must require participants to pay, with cash or a cash equivalent, an entry fee to participate; and (2) may not be based on the results of certain horse races. Provides that the division may adopt rules, including emergency rules, to implement the chapter, except for certain prohibited topics. Requires game operators or licensees to make a reasonable effort to withhold cash winnings of obligors for amounts the obligors are delinquent in child support and allows game operators or licensees to deduct and retain an administrative fee in relation to withholding the obligor's delinquent child support. Permits the department of child services to share delinquent child support obligors data with game operators. Prohibits a game operator from: (1) advertising a paid fantasy sports contest in any publication or medium that is aimed exclusively to juveniles; and (2) advertising a paid fantasy sports contest or running promotional activities concerning a paid fantasy sport contest at elementary schools, high schools, and at sports venues used exclusively for student sports activities. Urges the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topics of: (1) the regulation of paid fantasy sports; (2) the taxation of paid fantasy sports; and (3) the interception of past due taxes and child support owed by paid fantasy sports game players.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 339

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning trade regulation and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 4-31-2-20.6 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3 1, 2016]: **Sec. 20.6. "Simulcast" means the communication by
4 electronic device of a race at a recognized meeting and information
5 related to the race, including:**
6 (1) a personal computer or other device which enables
7 communication over the Internet;
8 (2) a private network;
9 (3) an interactive video display or television;
10 (4) a wireless communication technology; or
11 (5) an interactive computer service (as defined in
12 IC 35-45-5-1(g)).
13 SECTION 2. IC 4-33-24 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
14 A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
15 1, 2016]:
16 **Chapter 24. Paid Fantasy Sports**
17 **Sec. 1. A paid fantasy sports game conducted under this chapter**

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1 does not constitute gambling for any purpose, including under
2 IC 35-45-5.

3 Sec. 2. "Bureau" refers to the child support bureau of the
4 department of child services established by IC 31-25-3-1.

5 Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "confidential information"
6 means information related to the play of paid fantasy sports games
7 by game participants obtained solely as a result of or by virtue of
8 a person's employment.

9 Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "division" refers to the paid
10 fantasy sports division established by section 11 of this chapter.

11 Sec. 5. As used in this chapter, "game operator" means a person
12 who:

13 (1) is engaged in the business of professionally conducting
14 paid fantasy sports games for cash prizes for members of the
15 general public; and

16 (2) requires cash or a cash equivalent as an entry fee to be
17 paid by a member of the general public who participates in a
18 paid fantasy sports game.

19 Sec. 6. As used in this chapter, "game participant" means an
20 individual who participates in a paid fantasy sports game offered
21 by a game operator.

22 Sec. 7. As used in this chapter, "licensed facility" means any of
23 the following:

24 (1) A satellite facility licensed under IC 4-31-5.5.

25 (2) A riverboat (as defined by IC 4-33-2-17).

26 (3) A gambling game facility operated under IC 4-35.

27 Sec. 8. As used in this chapter, "licensee" means any of the
28 following:

29 (1) A permit holder (as defined by IC 4-31-2-14).

30 (2) A licensed owner (as defined by IC 4-33-2-13).

31 (3) An operating agent (as defined by IC 4-33-2-14.5).

32 Sec. 9. As used in this chapter, "paid fantasy sports game"
33 means any fantasy or simulation sports game or contest that meets
34 the following conditions:

35 (1) The values of all prizes and awards offered to winning
36 game participants are established and made known to the
37 game participants in advance of the game or contest.

38 (2) All winning outcomes reflect the relative knowledge and
39 skill of the game participants and are determined
40 predominantly by accumulated statistical results of the
41 performance of individuals, including athletes in the case of
42 sporting events.



1 (3) No winning outcome is based on the score, point spread, or
 2 performance or performances of any single team or
 3 combination of teams, or solely on any single performance of
 4 an individual athlete or player in any single event.

5 (4) The statistical results of the performance of individuals
 6 under subdivision (2) are not based on college or high school
 7 sports.

8 (5) All participants must pay, with cash or a cash equivalent,
 9 an entry fee to participate.

10 (6) Unless authorized by the horse racing commission,
 11 established by IC 4-31-3-1, no winning outcome is based on
 12 the accumulated statistical results of a performance by an
 13 individual or horse:

14 (A) in a race or races at a recognized meeting (as defined
 15 in IC 4-31-2-20); or

16 (B) on the simulcast, as defined in IC 4-31-2-20.6, of a
 17 horse race or horse races.

18 Sec. 10. As used in this chapter, "person" means any
 19 association, corporation, limited liability company, fiduciary,
 20 individual, joint stock company, joint venture, partnership, sole
 21 proprietorship, or other private legal entity.

22 Sec. 11. (a) The paid fantasy sports division is established within
 23 the commission.

24 (b) The division shall maintain the integrity of the paid fantasy
 25 sports division. Game operators, game operator applicants, and
 26 licensees must encourage confidence in the commission and the
 27 division by maintaining high standards of honesty, integrity, and
 28 impartiality.

29 Sec. 12. (a) Except as provided in subsection (c), the division has
 30 the following powers and duties for purposes of administering,
 31 regulating, and enforcing the system of paid fantasy sports under
 32 this chapter:

33 (1) All powers and duties in this chapter.

34 (2) All powers necessary and proper to fully and effectively
 35 execute this chapter.

36 (3) To investigate and reinvestigate applicants, game
 37 operators, and licensees with whom a game operator has
 38 entered into a contract under section 14 of this chapter.

39 (4) To investigate alleged violations of this chapter.

40 (5) To revoke, suspend, or renew licenses under this chapter.

41 (6) To take any reasonable or appropriate action to enforce
 42 this chapter.



1 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), the division may do the
2 following:

- 3 (1) Take appropriate administrative enforcement or
4 disciplinary action against a person who violates this chapter.
5 (2) Conduct hearings.
6 (3) Issue subpoenas for the attendance of witnesses and
7 subpoenas duces tecum for the production of books, records,
8 and other relevant documents.
9 (4) Administer oaths and affirmations to witnesses.

10 (c) The division may not adopt rules limiting or regulating:

- 11 (1) rules or the administration of an individual game or
12 contest;
13 (2) the statistical makeup of a game or contest; and
14 (3) the digital platform of a game operator.

15 Sec. 13. (a) The division shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2,
16 including emergency rules under IC 4-22-2-37.1, to implement this
17 chapter, including rules for the following purposes:

- 18 (1) Administering this chapter.
19 (2) Providing for the prevention of practices detrimental to
20 the public interest and providing for the best interests of paid
21 fantasy sports.
22 (3) Establishing rules concerning the review of the permits or
23 licenses necessary for a game operator, licensed facility, or
24 licensee.
25 (4) Imposing penalties for noncriminal violations of this
26 chapter.

27 (b) The division and the commission shall allow game operators
28 who are operating in Indiana on March 31, 2016, to continue
29 operating until they have received or have been denied a license.

30 Sec. 14. A game operator may:

- 31 (1) conduct one (1) or more paid fantasy sports games
32 through an Internet web site maintained and operated by the
33 game operator; or
34 (2) contract with a licensee to conduct one (1) or more paid
35 fantasy sports games on the premises of a licensed facility.

36 Sec. 15. (a) A game operator must:

- 37 (1) be authorized to transact business in Indiana under IC 23;
38 and
39 (2) pay to the division the initial fee imposed under subsection
40 (b).

41 (b) A game operator shall pay to the division an initial fee of at
42 least fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the privilege of conducting



1 paid fantasy sports games under this chapter. The division may
 2 increase the initial fee up to seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000)
 3 to pay for all of the direct and indirect costs of the operation of the
 4 division.

5 (c) A game operator shall annually pay to the division a five
 6 thousand dollar (\$5,000) fee on the anniversary date of the
 7 payment made under subsection (b) to renew the privilege of
 8 conducting paid fantasy sports games under this chapter.

9 (d) The division shall deposit all fees received under this section
 10 in the fantasy sports regulation and administration fund.

11 **Sec. 16. A game operator must do the following to conduct paid**
 12 **fantasy sports games under this chapter:**

13 (1) Provide written notice to the division of the game
 14 operator's intent to conduct paid fantasy sports games under
 15 this chapter.

16 (2) Submit for the division's approval any proposed contract
 17 with a licensee through which the game operator intends to
 18 conduct paid fantasy sports games under this chapter.

19 (3) Submit a plan for doing the following:

20 (A) Verifying the identity and age of patrons who wish to
 21 participate in a paid fantasy sports game conducted under
 22 this chapter.

23 (B) Maintaining the security of the identifying and
 24 financial information of game participants participating in
 25 paid fantasy sports games conducted under this chapter.

26 (C) Promoting paid fantasy sports games conducted under
 27 this chapter in a manner that accurately describes the
 28 relationship between the game operator and a licensee.

29 **Sec. 17. (a) A licensee's license may be renewed annually upon**
 30 **a determination by the division that the licensee is in compliance**
 31 **with this chapter.**

32 (b) A licensee shall undergo a complete investigation every three
 33 (3) years to determine if the licensee is in compliance with this
 34 chapter.

35 (c) A licensee shall bear the cost of an investigation or
 36 reinvestigation of the licensee and any investigation resulting from
 37 a potential transfer of ownership.

38 **Sec. 18. A game operator may charge an entry fee to participate**
 39 **in a paid fantasy sports game conducted under this chapter.**

40 **Sec. 19. An individual must be at least eighteen (18) years of age**
 41 **to participate in a paid fantasy sports game conducted under this**
 42 **chapter.**



1 **Sec. 20. Any prize awarded in a paid fantasy sports game must**
2 **be made known before the fantasy game begins. The value of a**
3 **prize awarded in the paid fantasy sports game may not be**
4 **determined by the number of game participants in the paid fantasy**
5 **sports game or the amount of entry fees paid by the game**
6 **participants.**

7 **Sec. 21. A game operator shall implement procedures to do the**
8 **following:**

9 **(1) Prevent employees of the game operator or a licensee with**
10 **whom the game operator has entered into a contract under**
11 **section 14 of this chapter, and any relative of an employee**
12 **living in the household of the employee, from competing in a**
13 **paid fantasy sports game in which the cash prize exceeds five**
14 **dollars (\$5).**

15 **(2) Prevent an owner, director, or officer of the game**
16 **operator or a licensee with whom the game operator has**
17 **entered into a contract under section 14 of this chapter from**
18 **being a game participant in any paid fantasy sports game**
19 **offered by the game operator.**

20 **(3) Prevent employees of the game operator or a licensee with**
21 **whom the game operator has entered into a contract under**
22 **section 14 of this chapter from sharing confidential**
23 **information that could affect paid fantasy sports game play**
24 **with third parties until the information is made publicly**
25 **available.**

26 **(4) Verify that a game participant is at least eighteen (18)**
27 **years of age.**

28 **(5) Prevent an individual who is a player, game official, or**
29 **other participant in an actual sporting event or competition**
30 **from participating in any paid fantasy sports game that is**
31 **determined in whole or in part on the performance of that**
32 **individual, the individual's actual team, or the accumulated**
33 **statistical results of the sporting event or competition in which**
34 **the individual is a player, game official, or other participant.**

35 **(6) Allow individuals to restrict themselves from entering paid**
36 **fantasy sports games.**

37 **(7) Disclose the number of paid fantasy sports games a single**
38 **game participant may enter.**

39 **Sec. 22. A game operator shall take reasonable steps to do the**
40 **following:**

41 **(1) Prevent the participation in paid fantasy sports games of**
42 **individuals who have restricted themselves from entering paid**



- 1 **fantasy sports games.**
2 **(2) Prevent game participants from entering more than the**
3 **maximum number of allowed paid fantasy sports games.**
4 **Sec. 23. A game operator shall segregate the funds of game**
5 **participants from the operational funds of the game operator.**
6 **Sec. 24. For the protection of the funds of game participants**
7 **held in paid fantasy sports game accounts, a game operator shall**
8 **maintain a reserve in the form of cash, cash equivalents, an**
9 **irrevocable letter of credit, a bond, or a combination of these**
10 **sources that is equal to the amount of money deposited in paid**
11 **fantasy sports game accounts of game participants.**
12 **Sec. 25. A game operator shall contract annually with a certified**
13 **public accountant to perform a financial audit of the game**
14 **operator's paid fantasy sports game operations under this chapter**
15 **to ensure compliance with this chapter. The game operator shall**
16 **submit the results of the audit to the division. The same certified**
17 **public accountant may not perform more than two (2) consecutive**
18 **financial audits for a game operator under this section.**
19 **Sec. 26. The division may impose a civil penalty upon a game**
20 **operator, a licensee, or an employee of a game operator or a**
21 **licensee for a violation of this chapter. The maximum amount of a**
22 **civil penalty imposed under this section for a particular violation**
23 **is one thousand dollars (\$1,000). The division shall deposit all civil**
24 **penalties received under this section in the fantasy sports**
25 **regulation and administration fund.**
26 **Sec. 27. Entry fees and other revenues received by a licensee**
27 **under a contract with a game operator for conducting paid fantasy**
28 **sports games are not considered to be received from a licensee's**
29 **gaming operations and are not subject to:**
30 **(1) a wagering tax imposed under IC 4-33-13 or IC 4-35-8;**

41 **(2) any money appropriated to the fund by the general**
42 **assembly; and**

 4 **currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same**

 7 **revert to the state general fund but remains in the fund to be used**
 8 **exclusively for purposes of this chapter.**
 9 **Sec. 29. (a) This section applies beginning July 1, 2017.**
 10 **(b) The bureau shall provide information to a game operator or**
 11 **licensee concerning persons who are delinquent in child support.**
 12 **(c) If a permit holder or trustee is required to file Form 1099 or**
 13 **a substantially equivalent form with the United States Internal**
 14 **Revenue Service for a person who is delinquent in child support,**
 15 **before payment of cash winnings from paid fantasy sports, the**
 16 **game operator or licensee permit holder or trustee:**
 17 **(1) may deduct and retain an administrative fee in the amount**
 18 **of the lesser of:**
 19 **(A) three percent (3%) of the amount of delinquent child**
 20 **support withheld under subdivision (2)(A); or**

11 (B) high schools, as defined by IC 20-18-2-7; or

12 (C) sports venues used exclusively for:

13 (i) elementary school, as defined by IC 20-18-2-4; or

14 (ii) high school, as defined by IC 20-18-2-7;

15 student sports activities.

Madam President: The Senate Committee on Public Policy, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 339, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

Page 1, line 14, delete "who" and insert "**who:**

(1)".

Page 1, line 16, delete "public." and insert "**public; and**

(2) requires cash or a cash equivalent as an entry fee to be paid by a member of the general public who participates in a paid fantasy sports game.".

Page 2, between lines 27 and 28, begin a new line block indented and insert:

"(4) The statistical results of the performance of individuals under subdivision (2) are not based on college or high school sports."

Page 3, line 23, delete "state general fund. Money deposited under this subsection is" and insert "**fantasy sports regulation and administration fund.**".

Page 3, delete lines 24 through 25.

Page 3, line 26, delete "before".

Page 3, line 27, delete "beginning".

Page 4, line 13, delete "state general fund. Money deposited under this subsection is" and insert "**fantasy sports regulation and administration fund.**".

Page 4, delete lines 14 through 15.

Page 6, line 2, delete "state general fund." and insert "**fantasy sports regulation and administration fund.**".

Page 6, delete lines 3 through 4.

Page 6, after line 13, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"Sec. 26. (a) The fantasy sports regulation and administration fund is established to provide for the administration of this chapter.

(b) The fund consists of:

(1) any fees and civil penalties deposited in the fund under this chapter;

(2) any money appropriated to the fund by the general assembly; and

(3) any earnings on amounts in the fund.

(c) The commission shall administer the fund.

(d) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not



currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same manner as other public funds may be invested.

(e) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not revert to the state general fund but remains in the fund to be used exclusively for purposes of this chapter.

SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2016] (a) Money in the fantasy sports regulation and administration fund established by IC 4-31-14-26 is appropriated for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, for the use by the Indiana horse racing commission in administering IC 4-31-14.

(f) The delinquent child support required to be withheld under this section and an administrative fee described under subsection (c)(1) have priority over any secured or unsecured claim on cash winnings except claims for federal or state taxes that are required to be withheld under federal or state law.
