SENATE BILL No. 348

DIGEST OF SB 348 (Updated February 14, 2023 12:00 pm - DI 106)

Citations Affected: IC 35-31.5; IC 35-43.

Synopsis: Residential harassment. Makes it residential harassment, a Class C misdemeanor, to picket or protest before or about a person's dwelling with the intent of harassing the person in the person's dwelling. Specifies that a person may only be taken into custody for the offense if the person refused an order to disperse.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

"Harass" or "harasses", for purposes of IC 35-45-17.1 and IC 35-43-2-4, has the meaning set forth in IC 35-45-17.1-1.".

Delete pages 2 through 3. Page 4, delete lines 1 through 13. Page 4, line 16, delete "disturb or". Page 4, delete lines 29 through 42. Delete pages 5 through 6. Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
