SENATE BILL No. 354

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 10-11-2.

Synopsis: State police officer compensation. Provides an annual salary increase for Indiana state police employees (peace officers), motor carrier inspectors, and capitol police officers. Provides that the increases are equal to 50% of the average annual salary percentage increase received by those state employees of the executive branch who are under a salary plan that is substantially similar to the salary matrix adopted by the state police board (board) for peace officers, motor carrier inspectors, and capitol police officers, respectively. However, provides that peace officers, motor carrier inspectors, and capitol police officers are not entitled to annual salary increases in a year in which those state employees of the executive branch who are under substantially similar salary plans did not receive increases. Requires the budget director to make the determination of those state employees of the executive branch who are under substantially similar salary plans and the average percentage amount of any salary increase those employees received, if any. Makes a technical correction.

SENATE BILL No. 354

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state offices and administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- SECTION 1. IC 10-11-2-10 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 10. (a) The superintendent, with the approval of the board, shall establish a classification of ranks, grades, and positions in the department.
- (b) For each rank, grade, and position established, the superintendent shall designate the authority and responsibility within the limits of this chapter.
- (c) For each rank, grade, and position established, the superintendent shall set standards of qualifications in conformity with the plans and standards most widely adopted in other states, dominions, and provinces. The superintendent shall fix the prerequisites of training, education, and experience for each rank, grade, and position.
- (d) The board, with the approval of the budget agency and the governor, shall prescribe the salaries to be paid for each rank, grade, and position, **including any increases required under this chapter.**
- (e) The superintendent, with the approval of the board and in accordance with the rules adopted by the superintendent, shall



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designate the rank, grade, and position held by each employee of the department until the superintendent designates an employee to hold another rank, grade, or position. The superintendent may assign and reassign each employee of the department to serve at stations and to perform within the limits of this chapter the duties the superintendent designates to the employee. The superintendent may determine the conditions and amounts of bonds required in appropriate cases.

SECTION 2. IC 10-11-2-13, AS AMENDED BY P.L.234-2007, SECTION 306, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 13. (a) The board shall categorize salaries of police employees within each rank based upon the rank held and the number of years of service in the department through the twentieth year. The salary ranges the board assigns to each rank shall be divided into a base salary and twenty (20) increments above the base salary, with:

- (1) the base salary in the rank paid to a person with less than one
- (1) year of service in the department; and
- (2) the highest salary in the rank paid to a person with at least twenty (20) years of service in the department.
- (b) The salary matrix prescribed by this section, and any increase under subsection (d), shall be reviewed and approved by the budget agency before implementation.
- (c) For each state fiscal year beginning after June 30, 2021, the budget director shall determine, on July 1 of the current state fiscal year compared to the immediately preceding state fiscal year, the average annual salary percentage increase, if any, received by those state employees of the executive branch who, as determined by the budget director, are under a salary plan that is substantially similar to the salary matrix for police employees under this section. The budget director shall make the determination under this subsection on or before July 10 of the state fiscal year and shall notify the board of the amount of any percentage increase determined under this subsection not later than July 15 of the state fiscal year.
- (d) Beginning after June 30, 2021, if the budget director determines under subsection (c) that state employees of the executive branch (as described in subsection (c)) received a salary increase, the board shall update the salary matrix under this section for the state fiscal year in which the notice is received under subsection (c) to increase, beginning July 1 of the state fiscal year, the salary for all police employees under this chapter by a percentage amount equal to:

- section. The budget director shall make the determination under this subsection on or before July 10 of the state fiscal year and shall notify the board of the amount of any percentage increase determined under this subsection not later than July 15 of the state fiscal year.
- (e) Beginning after June 30, 2021, if the budget director determines under subsection (d) that state employees of the executive branch (as described in subsection (d)) received a salary increase, the board shall update the salary matrix under this section for the state fiscal year in which the notice is received under subsection (d) to increase, beginning July 1 of the state fiscal year, the salary for all motor carrier inspectors under the salary matrix by a percentage amount equal to:
 - (1) the percentage increase determined by the budget director under subsection (d); multiplied by
 - (2) fifty percent (50%).

- A motor carrier inspector is not entitled to receive a salary increase under this subsection in a state fiscal year in which the budget director determines under subsection (d) that state employees of the executive branch (as described in subsection (d)) did not receive a salary increase as determined under that subsection.
- (f) If salary increases are required under subsection (e), the budget director shall augment the appropriations in the state biennial budget for motor carrier inspectors in an amount sufficient to pay for the salary increases from funds as determined by the budget director.
- SECTION 4. IC 10-11-2-28.5, AS ADDED BY P.L.83-2006, SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 28.5. (a) After June 30, 2007, the board shall use a salary matrix that categorizes salaries of capitol police officers described in section 28 of this chapter within each rank based upon the rank held and the number of years of service in the department through the tenth year. The salary ranges the board assigns to each rank shall be divided into a base salary and ten (10) increments above the base salary, with:
 - (1) the base salary in the rank paid to a capitol police officer with less than one (1) year of service in the department; and
 - (2) the highest salary in the rank paid to a capitol police officer with at least ten (10) years of service in the department.
- (b) For purposes of creating the salary matrix prescribed by this section, the board may not approve salary ranges for any rank of capitol



- police officers that are less than the salary ranges effective for that rank on January 1, 2006.
- (c) The salary matrix prescribed by this section, and any increase under subsection (f), shall be reviewed and approved by the budget agency before implementation.
- (d) The salary matrix developed under subsection (a), **including any increase under subsection (f)**, must use the same percentage differentials between increments that are used for the salary matrix for police employees under IC 10-11-2-13. **section 13 of this chapter.**
- (e) For each state fiscal year beginning after June 30, 2021, the budget director shall determine, on July 1 of the current state fiscal year compared to the immediately preceding state fiscal year, the average annual salary percentage increase, if any, received by those state employees of the executive branch who, as determined by the budget director, are under a salary plan that is substantially similar to the salary matrix for capitol police officers under this section. The budget director shall make the determination under this subsection on or before July 10 of the state fiscal year and shall notify the board of the amount of any percentage increase determined under this subsection not later than July 15 of the state fiscal year.
- (f) Beginning after June 30, 2021, if the budget director determines under subsection (e) that state employees of the executive branch (as described in subsection (e)) received a salary increase, the board shall update the salary matrix under this section for the state fiscal year in which the notice is received under subsection (e) to increase, beginning July 1 of the state fiscal year, the salary for all capitol police officers under the salary matrix by a percentage amount equal to:
 - (1) the percentage increase determined by the budget director under subsection (e); multiplied by
 - (2) fifty percent (50%).
- A capitol police officer is not entitled to receive a salary increase under this subsection in a state fiscal year in which the budget director determines under subsection (e) that state employees of the executive branch (as described in subsection (e)) did not receive a salary increase as determined under that subsection.
- (g) If salary increases are required under subsection (f), the budget director shall augment the appropriations in the state biennial budget for capitol police officers in an amount sufficient to pay for the salary increases from funds as determined by the budget director.
