DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 4-32.2-3-4.

Synopsis: Bingo supplies for the visually impaired. Provides that the gaming commission shall require an entity that sells, distributes, or manufactures a bingo item to sell, distribute, or manufacture such an item in large print and in a form readable by individuals with a visual impairment.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning gaming.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	(B) committed any other act that would negatively impact the
2	integrity of charity gaming in Indiana.
3	(2) The applicant has engaged in fraud, deceit, or
4	misrepresentation.
5	(3) The applicant has failed to provide information required by
6	this article or a rule adopted under this article.
7	(d) The commission shall require an entity licensed under this
8	article that sells, distributes, or manufactures a licensed supply (as
9	defined in IC 4-32.2-2-19) to sell, distribute, or manufacture such
10	an item in large print and in a form readable by individuals with
11	a visual impairment.
