DIGEST OF SB 461 (Updated February 9, 2023 11:28 am - DI 87)

Citations Affected: IC 36-1.

Synopsis: Short term rentals. Permits a unit to charge a \$25 annual short term rental inspection fee.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

SENATE BILL No. 461

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning property.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 36-1-24-10, AS ADDED BY P.L.73-2018,
2	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2023]: Sec. 10. (a) A unit may enact or enforce a law or plan
4	that regulates, prohibits, or limits short term rentals only for the
5	following primary purposes:
6	(1) Protection of the public's health and safety related to:
7	(A) fire and building safety;
8	(B) sanitation;
9	(C) transportation;
10	(D) traffic control; and
11	(E) pollution control;
12	if enforcement is performed in the same manner as enforcement
13	that applies to similar properties that are not short term rentals.
14	(2) Residential use and zoning related to:
15	(A) noise;
16	(B) protection of welfare;
17	(C) property maintenance; and



1	(D) nuisance issues;
2	if enforcement is performed in the same manner as enforcement
3	that applies to similar properties that are not short term rentals.
4	(3) To limit or prohibit use of short term rentals for the following
5	purposes:
6	(A) To house sex offenders.
7	(B) To operate a structured sober living home.
8	(C) To manufacture, exhibit, distribute, or sell illegal drugs,
9	liquor, pornography, or obscenity.
10	(D) To operate an adult entertainment establishment (as
11	defined in IC 12-7-2-1.8).
12	(4) To limit or prohibit short term rentals located within the
13	boundaries of a conservancy district established under IC 14-33.
14	(5) To provide the unit with an emergency contact for a short term
15	rental.
16	(b) A unit may impose an annual inspection fee of not more than
17	twenty-five dollars (\$25) on a short term rental property that is not
18	an owner occupied short term rental property. If a short term
19	rental property has more than one (1) rental unit used as a short
20	term rental property, the fee applies to each rental unit used as a
21	short term rental property. This fee is in addition to the
22	registration for described in IC 36-1-20-5 if applicable
