## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 36-1-8.5-2.

**Synopsis:** Restricted address program. Adds: (1) public safety telecommunicators; and (2) 911 emergency call dispatch center administrators; to the persons who may restrict access to their home address on a local government's public property data base website.

Effective: July 1, 2025.
