DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-38.1-1-12.

Synopsis: Equine therapy. Provides that equine massage and manipulation therapy are not included in the practice of veterinary medicine.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 25-38.1-1-12, AS ADDED BY P.L.58-2008,
- 2 SECTION 12, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
- 3 JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 12. (a) "Practice of veterinary medicine" means:
- 4 (1) representing oneself as engaged in the practice of veterinary
- 5 medicine, veterinary surgery, or veterinary dentistry or any of
- 6 their branches or specialties;
- 7 (2) using words, letters, or titles in a connection or under
- 8 circumstances that may induce another person to believe that the
- 9 person using them is engaged in the practice of veterinary
- 10 medicine, veterinary surgery, or veterinary dentistry;
- 11 (3) accepting compensation for doing any of the things described
- 12 in subdivisions (4) through (8);
- 13 (4) providing the diagnosis, treatment, correction, or prevention
- 14 of any disease, defect, injury, deformity, pain, or condition of
- 15 animals;
- 16 (5) prescribing, dispensing, or ordering the administration of a



- 1 drug, a medicine, a biologic, a medical appliance, an application,
2 or treatment of whatever nature for the prevention, cure, or relief
3 of any disease, ailment, defect, injury, deformity, pain, or other
4 condition of animals;
5 (6) performing a:
6 (A) surgical or dental operation; or
7 (B) complimentary or alternative therapy;
8 upon an animal;
9 (7) certifying the health, fitness, or soundness of an animal; or
10 (8) performing any procedure for the diagnosis of pregnancy,
11 sterility, or infertility upon animals.
12 **(b) However, The term does not include:**
13 **(1) administering a drug, medicine, appliance, application, or**
14 **treatment that is administered at the direction and under the direct**
15 **supervision of a veterinarian licensed under this article; or**
16 **(2) equine massage and manipulation therapy performed**
17 **under the supervision of a veterinarian licensed under this**
18 **article. Equine massage and manipulation therapy does not**
19 **include:**
20 **(A) prescribing a drug;**
21 **(B) performing surgery; or**
22 **(C) diagnosing a medical condition.**
