6 *Sherrick, Thelma graduated from Valparaiso High School and*  
7 *married Max Dickey in 1942;*

8           *Whereas, Thelma attended Ball State University to study*  
9 *education, and later earned her Masters of Education from*  
10 *Valparaiso University;*

11           *Whereas, Passionate about educating Indiana's youth,*  
12 *Thelma spent 25 years teaching at Cooks Corners and Central*  
13 *Elementary Schools in Valparaiso before retiring in 1970;*

14           *Whereas, Throughout her life, Thelma was very active in*  
15 *her community as a lifelong member of First Christian Church,*  
16 *past president of the Delta Theta Tau Sorority, a member of the*  
17 *Library Board, and numerous other organizations;*
