SENATE RESOLUTION No. 9

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the legislative council to assign
to the Criminal Law and Sentencing Policy Study Committee the topic
of raising the age of consent from 16 to 18 years of age.
Whereas, The age of consent is the age at or above which
a person is considered to have the legal capacity to consent
to sexual activity;
Whereas, The age of consent in Indiana is 16 years of age;
Whereas, It is presumed that before 16 years of age
children are not capable legally of consenting to sexual
activity;
Whereas, It is undeniably true that children form a special
and vulnerable group in our society;
Whereas, Below a certain minimum age, children are at
risk of not having the physiological, biological, and
emotional development to cope with sex and the many
possible consequences of having sex; and
Whereas, The decisions our young people make can affect
the rest of their lives; it behooves the state of Indiana to
ensure that they are old enough to make the correct decision:
