
SUBJECT: Fiscal Note for SB 433 by Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare

In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning SB 433 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

SB 433 would clarify that institutional licenses could be issued to an employee of a third party contractor of the Department of Corrections or the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services. The bill would limit the employment of license holders to the institution to which the holder is assigned.

According to the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services, and the Kansas Department of Corrections, enactment of SB 433 would not have a fiscal effect on agency operations for any of the respective agencies.
