AN ACT concerning elections; requiring a manual audit of certain election results.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Prior to the meeting of the county board of canvassers to certify the official election results for any election in which the canvassers certify the results, the county election officer shall conduct a manual audit or tally of each vote cast, regardless of the method of voting, in 1% of all precincts located within the county or in a district or race designated by the secretary of state.

- (b) The audit shall be performed manually and shall review the paper ballot or paper ballot equivalent on any electronic voting device. The audit shall be performed by a sworn election board consisting of bi-partisan trained board members. The county election officer will determine the members of the sworn election board who will conduct the audit.
- (c) At least five days prior to the audit, notice of the time and location of the audit shall be provided to the public on the official county website. The audit shall be conducted in a public setting. Any candidate or entity who is authorized to appoint a poll watcher may appoint a poll watcher for the audit.
- (d) The results of the audit shall be compared to the unofficial election night returns and a report shall be submitted to the county election office and to the secretary of state's office prior to the meeting of the county board of canvassers. If a discrepancy is reported between the audit and the unofficial returns and cannot be resolved, the county election officer or the secretary of state may require audits of additional precincts. Once the audit has been completed, the results of the audit shall be used by the county board of canvassers when certifying the official election results.
- (e) The secretary of state shall adopt rules and regulations governing the conduct and procedure of the audit, including the random selection of the precinct districts.
- Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2017 and its publication in the statute book.
