AN ACT concerning the department of health and environment; relating to
childcare licensing service contracts; requiring the secretary of health
and environment to not renew such contracts and replacing licensing
services with state employees; requiring the secretary to conduct
surveys of childcare providers relating to the department's provision of
childcare licensing services.

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8 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

9 Section 1. (a) On and after July 1, 2025, whenever a contract with a 10 city, county or any other entity, to provide childcare licensing services 11 expires, the secretary of health and environment shall not renew such contract and shall replace the services provided with full-time equivalent 12 13 state employees in the unclassified service as may be necessary to continue 14 the provision of such services. Subject to appropriations, the secretary 15 shall utilize the funds previously allocated to the contracted entities and 16 shall seek reimbursement for any costs in excess of the previously 17 allocated funds from the department of children and families as may be 18 allowed pursuant to the agreement for reimbursement of costs between the 19 agencies or any other available funds.

20 (b) (1) On and after July 1, 2025, the secretary of health and 21 environment shall conduct an annual survey of all licensed child care 22 providers in order to seek feedback on licensing services provided by the 23 department of health and environment and the inspection process. The 24 secretary may conduct such survey electronically and include any other 25 relevant topics selected by the secretary. A licensee may answer survey 26 questions anonymously but shall identify the location of the child care 27 facility by city or county.

28 (2) Beginning in 2026, on or before the first day of each regular 29 legislative session, the secretary shall prepare and submit a report 30 containing a summary of the survey results to the house of representatives 31 standing committee on commerce, labor and economic development, the 32 senate standing committee on public health and welfare and the senate 33 standing committee on commerce, or their successor committees.

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Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its

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1 publication in the statute book.
