AN ACT concerning the state health care benefits program; designating 1 2 employees of certain charitable organizations as eligible for coverage 3 thereto; amending K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 75-6506 and 75-6508 and 4 repealing the existing sections. 5 6 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:* 7 Section 1. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 75-6506 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-6506. (a) The participation of a person qualified to participate 8 in the state health care benefits program shall be voluntary, and the cost of 9 10 the state health care benefits program for such person shall be established 11 by the Kansas state employees health care commission. 12 (b) Periodic deductions from state payrolls may be made in 13 accordance with procedures prescribed by the secretary of administration to cover the costs of the state health care benefits program payable by 14 persons who are on the state payroll when authorized by such persons. Any 15 such periodic payroll deductions in effect on an implementation date for 16 biweekly payroll periods shall be collected in the manner prescribed by the 17 secretary of administration. 18 19 (c) (1) In the event that The Kansas state employees health care 20 commission designates by may designate, through rules and regulations, a 21 group of persons on the payroll of any of the following entities as qualified 22 to participate in the state employee health plan a: 23 (A) County, township, city, special district or other local 24 governmental entity-: 25 *(B)* public school district-; 26 (C) licensed child care facility operated by a not-for-profit 27 corporation providing residential group foster care for children and 28 receiving reimbursement for all or part of such care from the Kansas 29 department for children and families; 30 nonprofit community mental health center, as provided in K.S.A. (D)31 19-4001 et seq., and amendments thereto; 32 (E) nonprofit community facility for people with intellectual disability, as provided in K.S.A. 19-4001 et seq., and amendments thereto-33 34 or: 35 (F) nonprofit independent living agency, as defined in K.S.A. 65-36 5101, and amendments thereto; or

1 (G) nonprofit charitable organization that provides services or food 2 support to Kansas residents who are elderly or disabled, if such nonprofit 3 charitable organization receives 75% or more of its funding through 4 grants from the Kansas department for children and families, the Kansas 5 department for aging and disability services or the Kansas department of 6 health and environment.

7 as qualified to participate in the state health care benefits programIf 8 such designation is made, then periodic deductions from payrolls of the 9 local governmental entity, public school district, licensed child care facility operated by a not-for-profit corporation providing residential group foster 10 eare for children and receiving reimbursement for all or part of such care 11 from the Kansas department for children and families, nonprofit-12 community mental health center, as provided in K.S.A. 19-4001 et seq., 13 and amendments thereto, nonprofit community facility for people with 14 intellectual disability, as provided in K.S.A. 19-4001 et seq., and 15 16 amendments thereto, or nonprofit independent living agency, as defined in K.S.A. 65-5101, and amendments thereto, entities designated in 17 subsection (c)(1) may be made to cover the costs of the state health care 18 19 benefits program payable by such persons when authorized by such 20 persons. All such moneys deducted from payrolls shall be remitted to the Kansas state employees health care commission in accordance with the 21 22 directions of the commission.

(d) Whenever the Kansas state employees health care commission
designates any entity listed in subsection (c) as qualified to participate in
the state health care benefits program, such entity's participation shall be
conditioned upon the following:

27 (1) At least 70% of such entity's employees shall participate in the28 state health care plan;

(2) except as provided by paragraph (6) of this subsection, the rate of
the premium paid by the entity as the employer's share of the total amount
of premium paid shall be at least equal to the rate paid by the state of
Kansas for its employees;

(3) the entity shall not create, maintain or permit any exemption from
participation in the state health care plan for such entity's employees;

(4) the rate charged to such entity shall be sufficient to pay for any
 administrative or underwriting costs incurred by the state employees health
 care commission;

(5) the rate charged to such entity shall not increase the rate ofpremium paid by the state of Kansas for its employees;

40 (6) the entity shall elect to participate for a minimum of three 41 consecutive years in the state health care benefits program; and

42 (7) the commission may authorize an entity to pay less than the state 43 rate for the employee coverage for no more than three years and no more than five years for dependent coverage on the condition that the entity
 elects to participate for at least three consecutive years after first paying
 the state rate for employee coverage.

Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 75-6508 is hereby amended to read as 4 follows: 75-6508. (a) (1) Each state agency-which that has on its payroll 5 persons participating in the state health care benefits program shall pay 6 7 from any moneys available to the agency for such purpose an amount 8 specified by the Kansas state employees health care commission, including any amounts prescribed under a cafeteria plan established under K.S.A. 9 75-6512, and amendments thereto. All such payments shall continue on the 10 behalf of employees otherwise eligible for participation in the state health 11 12 care benefits program in accordance with the continuation provisions of the federal family and medical leave act of 1993, P.L. 103-03, 107 Stat. 6. 13 The commission may charge each state agency a uniform amount per 14 15 person as the cost to the agency for the state's contribution for persons 16 participating in the state health care benefits program. Such amounts may 17 include the costs of administering the program.

18 (2) In the event that If, through rules and regulations, the Kansas 19 state employees health care commission designates as qualified to 20 participate in the state health care benefits program by rules and 21 regulations a group of persons on the payroll of any of the following 22 entities a:
