AN ACT concerning crimes, punishment and criminal procedure; relating to crimes affecting government functions; adding harboring or concealing a person who is alleged to have violated terms of probation to the crime of obstructing apprehension or prosecution; amending K.S.A. 21-5913 and repealing the existing section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. K.S.A. 21-5913 is hereby amended to read as follows: 21-5913. (a) Obstructing apprehension or prosecution is knowingly harboring, concealing or aiding any person who:

- (1) Has committed or who has been charged with committing a felony or misdemeanor under the laws of this state, other than a violation of K.S.A. 22-4903, and amendments thereto, or another state or the United States with intent that such person shall avoid or escape from arrest, trial, conviction or punishment for such felony or misdemeanor; or
- (2) is required to register under the Kansas offender registration act, K.S.A. 22-4901 et seq., and amendments thereto, and who is not in compliance with the requirements of such act with intent that such person shall avoid or escape from registration, arrest, trial, conviction, punishment or any criminal charges arising from the person's failure to comply with the requirements of such act; or
- (3) is alleged to have violated the terms and conditions of probation, assignment to a community correctional services program, parole or postrelease supervision, conditional release or a suspended sentence.
 - (b) Obstructing apprehension or prosecution as defined in:
 - (1) Subsection (a)(1) or (a)(3) is a:
- (A) Severity level 8, nonperson felony if the person who is harbored, concealed or aided has committed or has been charged with committing a felony; and
- (B) class C misdemeanor if the person who is aided has committed or has been charged with committing a misdemeanor; and
 - (2) subsection (a)(2) is a severity level 5, person felony.

- Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the statute book.
