1 AN ACT concerning tax-advantaged savings programs; allowing the
2 taxpayer to elect the taxable year in which a subtraction modification
3 for contributions to 529 qualified tuition accounts, ABLE accounts or
4 first-time home buyer savings accounts would be applied; authorizing
5 the state treasurer to appoint a 529 program advisory council; amending
6 K.S.A. 75-644 and K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 79-32,117 and repealing the
7 existing sections.
8

9 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:*

10 Section 1. K.S.A. 75-644 is hereby amended to read as follows: 75-
11 644. (a) The state treasurer shall implement and administer the program
12 under the terms and conditions established by K.S.A. 75-640 ~~to~~ through
13 75-648, and amendments thereto.

14 (b) In furtherance of such implementation and administration, the
15 state treasurer shall have the authority and responsibility to:

16 (1) Develop and implement the program in a manner consistent with
17 the provisions of K.S.A. 75-640 ~~to~~ through 75-648, and amendments
18 thereto, through adoption of rules and regulations;

19 (2) engage the services of consultants on a contract basis for
20 rendering professional and technical assistance and advice;

21 (3) seek rulings and other guidance from the United States
22 department of treasury and the federal internal revenue service relating to
23 the program;

24 (4) make changes to the program required for the participants in the
25 program to obtain the federal income tax benefits or treatment provided by
26 section 529 of the federal internal revenue code of 1986, as amended, or
27 any similar successor legislation;

28 (5) charge, impose and collect administrative fees and service charges
29 in connection with any agreement, contract or transaction relating to the
30 program;

31 (6) develop marketing plans and promotion material;

32 (7) establish the methods by which the funds held in accounts shall be
33 ~~dispersed~~ *disbursed*;

34 (8) establish the method by which funds shall be allocated to pay for
35 administrative costs;

36 (9) do all things necessary and proper to carry out the purposes of

1 K.S.A. 75-640 ~~to~~ through 75-648, and amendments thereto;

2 (10) adopt rules and regulations necessary to administer K.S.A. 75-
3 640 ~~to~~ through 75-648, and amendments thereto; ~~and~~

4 (11) evaluate the Kansas postsecondary education savings program
5 annually, and make a report thereon to the governor and legislature for the
6 period; *and*

7 (12) *appoint an advisory council to make recommendations for the*
8 *implementation and operation of the program. The state treasurer shall*
9 *determine the membership of the committee, and members shall serve at*
10 *the pleasure of the state treasurer. No member of the advisory council*
11 *appointed pursuant to this paragraph shall receive any compensation,*
12 *subsistence, mileage or other allowance for serving on the advisory*
13 *council.*

14 Sec. 2. K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 79-32,117 is hereby amended to read as
15 follows: 79-32,117. (a) The Kansas adjusted gross income of an individual
16 means such individual's federal adjusted gross income for the taxable year,
17 with the modifications specified in this section.

18 (b) There shall be added to federal adjusted gross income:

19 (i) Interest income less any related expenses directly incurred in the
20 purchase of state or political subdivision obligations, to the extent that the
21 same is not included in federal adjusted gross income, on obligations of
22 any state or political subdivision thereof, but to the extent that interest
23 income on obligations of this state or a political subdivision thereof issued
24 prior to January 1, 1988, is specifically exempt from income tax under the
25 laws of this state authorizing the issuance of such obligations, it shall be
26 excluded from computation of Kansas adjusted gross income whether or
27 not included in federal adjusted gross income. Interest income on
28 obligations of this state or a political subdivision thereof issued after
29 December 31, 1987, shall be excluded from computation of Kansas
30 adjusted gross income whether or not included in federal adjusted gross
31 income.

32 (ii) Taxes on or measured by income or fees or payments in lieu of
33 income taxes imposed by this state or any other taxing jurisdiction to the
34 extent deductible in determining federal adjusted gross income and not
35 credited against federal income tax. This paragraph shall not apply to taxes
36 imposed under the provisions of K.S.A. 79-1107 or 79-1108, and
37 amendments thereto, for privilege tax year 1995, and all such years
38 thereafter.

39 (iii) The federal net operating loss deduction, except that the federal
40 net operating loss deduction shall not be added to an individual's federal
41 adjusted gross income for tax years beginning after December 31, 2016.

42 (iv) Federal income tax refunds received by the taxpayer if the
43 deduction of the taxes being refunded resulted in a tax benefit for Kansas

1 income tax purposes during a prior taxable year. Such refunds shall be
2 included in income in the year actually received regardless of the method
3 of accounting used by the taxpayer. For purposes hereof, a tax benefit shall
4 be deemed to have resulted if the amount of the tax had been deducted in
5 determining income subject to a Kansas income tax for a prior year
6 regardless of the rate of taxation applied in such prior year to the Kansas
7 taxable income, but only that portion of the refund shall be included as
8 bears the same proportion to the total refund received as the federal taxes
9 deducted in the year to which such refund is attributable bears to the total
10 federal income taxes paid for such year. For purposes of the foregoing
11 sentence, federal taxes shall be considered to have been deducted only to
12 the extent such deduction does not reduce Kansas taxable income below
13 zero.

14 (v) The amount of any depreciation deduction or business expense
15 deduction claimed on the taxpayer's federal income tax return for any
16 capital expenditure in making any building or facility accessible to the
17 handicapped, for which expenditure the taxpayer claimed the credit
18 allowed by K.S.A. 79-32,177, and amendments thereto.

19 (vi) Any amount of designated employee contributions picked up by
20 an employer pursuant to K.S.A. 12-5005, 20-2603, 74-4919 and 74-4965,
21 and amendments thereto.

22 (vii) The amount of any charitable contribution made to the extent the
23 same is claimed as the basis for the credit allowed pursuant to K.S.A. 79-
24 32,196, and amendments thereto.

25 (viii) The amount of any costs incurred for improvements to a swine
26 facility, claimed for deduction in determining federal adjusted gross
27 income, to the extent the same is claimed as the basis for any credit
28 allowed pursuant to K.S.A. 79-32,204, and amendments thereto.

29 (ix) The amount of any ad valorem taxes and assessments paid and
30 the amount of any costs incurred for habitat management or construction
31 and maintenance of improvements on real property, claimed for deduction
32 in determining federal adjusted gross income, to the extent the same is
33 claimed as the basis for any credit allowed pursuant to K.S.A. 79-32,203,
34 and amendments thereto.

35 (x) Amounts received as nonqualified withdrawals, as defined by
36 K.S.A. 75-643, and amendments thereto, if, at the time of contribution to a
37 family postsecondary education savings account, such amounts were
38 subtracted from the federal adjusted gross income pursuant to subsection
39 (c)(xv) or if such amounts are not already included in the federal adjusted
40 gross income.

41 (xi) The amount of any contribution made to the same extent the
42 same is claimed as the basis for the credit allowed pursuant to K.S.A. 74-
43 50,154, and amendments thereto.

1 (xii) For taxable years commencing after December 31, 2004,
2 amounts received as withdrawals not in accordance with the provisions of
3 K.S.A. 74-50,204, and amendments thereto, if, at the time of contribution
4 to an individual development account, such amounts were subtracted from
5 the federal adjusted gross income pursuant to subsection (c)(xiii), or if
6 such amounts are not already included in the federal adjusted gross
7 income.

8 (xiii) The amount of any expenditures claimed for deduction in
9 determining federal adjusted gross income, to the extent the same is
10 claimed as the basis for any credit allowed pursuant to K.S.A. 79-32,217
11 through 79-32,220 or 79-32,222, and amendments thereto.

12 (xiv) The amount of any amortization deduction claimed in
13 determining federal adjusted gross income to the extent the same is
14 claimed for deduction pursuant to K.S.A. 79-32,221, and amendments
15 thereto.

16 (xv) The amount of any expenditures claimed for deduction in
17 determining federal adjusted gross income, to the extent the same is
18 claimed as the basis for any credit allowed pursuant to K.S.A. 79-32,223
19 through 79-32,226, 79-32,228 through 79-32,231, 79-32,233 through 79-
20 32,236, 79-32,238 through 79-32,241, 79-32,245 through 79-32,248 or 79-
21 32,251 through 79-32,254, and amendments thereto.

22 (xvi) The amount of any amortization deduction claimed in
23 determining federal adjusted gross income to the extent the same is
24 claimed for deduction pursuant to K.S.A. 79-32,227, 79-32,232, 79-
25 32,237, 79-32,249, 79-32,250 or 79-32,255, and amendments thereto.

26 (xvii) The amount of any amortization deduction claimed in
27 determining federal adjusted gross income to the extent the same is
28 claimed for deduction pursuant to K.S.A. 79-32,256, and amendments
29 thereto.

30 (xviii) For taxable years commencing after December 31, 2006, the
31 amount of any ad valorem or property taxes and assessments paid to a state
32 other than Kansas or local government located in a state other than Kansas
33 by a taxpayer who resides in a state other than Kansas, when the law of
34 such state does not allow a resident of Kansas who earns income in such
35 other state to claim a deduction for ad valorem or property taxes or
36 assessments paid to a political subdivision of the state of Kansas in
37 determining taxable income for income tax purposes in such other state, to
38 the extent that such taxes and assessments are claimed as an itemized
39 deduction for federal income tax purposes.

40 (xix) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2012, and
41 ending before January 1, 2017, the amount of any: (1) Loss from business
42 as determined under the federal internal revenue code and reported from
43 schedule C and on line 12 of the taxpayer's form 1040 federal individual

1 income tax return; (2) loss from rental real estate, royalties, partnerships, S
2 corporations, except those with wholly owned subsidiaries subject to the
3 Kansas privilege tax, estates, trusts, residual interest in real estate
4 mortgage investment conduits and net farm rental as determined under the
5 federal internal revenue code and reported from schedule E and on line 17
6 of the taxpayer's form 1040 federal individual income tax return; and (3)
7 farm loss as determined under the federal internal revenue code and
8 reported from schedule F and on line 18 of the taxpayer's form 1040
9 federal income tax return; all to the extent deducted or subtracted in
10 determining the taxpayer's federal adjusted gross income. For purposes of
11 this subsection, references to the federal form 1040 and federal schedule
12 C, schedule E, and schedule F, shall be to such form and schedules as they
13 existed for tax year 2011, and as revised thereafter by the internal revenue
14 service.

15 (xx) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2012, and
16 ending before January 1, 2017, the amount of any deduction for self-
17 employment taxes under section 164(f) of the federal internal revenue
18 code as in effect on January 1, 2012, and amendments thereto, in
19 determining the federal adjusted gross income of an individual taxpayer, to
20 the extent the deduction is attributable to income reported on schedule C,
21 E or F and on line 12, 17 or 18 of the taxpayer's form 1040 federal income
22 tax return.

23 (xxi) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2012, and
24 ending before January 1, 2017, the amount of any deduction for pension,
25 profit sharing, and annuity plans of self-employed individuals under
26 section 62(a)(6) of the federal internal revenue code as in effect on January
27 1, 2012, and amendments thereto, in determining the federal adjusted gross
28 income of an individual taxpayer.

29 (xxii) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2012, and
30 ending before January 1, 2017, the amount of any deduction for health
31 insurance under section 162(l) of the federal internal revenue code as in
32 effect on January 1, 2012, and amendments thereto, in determining the
33 federal adjusted gross income of an individual taxpayer.

34 (xxiii) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2012, and
35 ending before January 1, 2017, the amount of any deduction for domestic
36 production activities under section 199 of the federal internal revenue code
37 as in effect on January 1, 2012, and amendments thereto, in determining
38 the federal adjusted gross income of an individual taxpayer.

39 (xxiv) For taxable years commencing after December 31, 2013, that
40 portion of the amount of any expenditure deduction claimed in
41 determining federal adjusted gross income for expenses paid for medical
42 care of the taxpayer or the taxpayer's spouse or dependents when such
43 expenses were paid or incurred for an abortion, or for a health benefit plan,

1 as defined in K.S.A. 65-6731, and amendments thereto, for the purchase of
2 an optional rider for coverage of abortion in accordance with K.S.A. 40-
3 2,190, and amendments thereto, to the extent that such taxes and
4 assessments are claimed as an itemized deduction for federal income tax
5 purposes.

6 (xxv) For taxable years commencing after December 31, 2013, that
7 portion of the amount of any expenditure deduction claimed in
8 determining federal adjusted gross income for expenses paid by a taxpayer
9 for health care when such expenses were paid or incurred for abortion
10 coverage, a health benefit plan, as defined in K.S.A. 65-6731, and
11 amendments thereto, when such expenses were paid or incurred for
12 abortion coverage or amounts contributed to health savings accounts for
13 such taxpayer's employees for the purchase of an optional rider for
14 coverage of abortion in accordance with K.S.A. 40-2,190, and
15 amendments thereto, to the extent that such taxes and assessments are
16 claimed as a deduction for federal income tax purposes.

17 (xxvi) For all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2016, the
18 amount of any charitable contribution made to the extent the same is
19 claimed as the basis for the credit allowed pursuant to K.S.A. 72-4357, and
20 amendments thereto, and is also claimed as an itemized deduction for
21 federal income tax purposes.

22 (xxvii) For all taxable years commencing after December 31, 2020,
23 the amount deducted by reason of a carryforward of disallowed business
24 interest pursuant to section 163(j) of the federal internal revenue code of
25 1986, as in effect on January 1, 2018.

26 (xxviii) For all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2021, the
27 amount of any contributions to, or earnings from, a first-time home buyer
28 savings account if distributions from the account were not used to pay for
29 expenses or transactions authorized pursuant to K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 58-
30 4904, and amendments thereto, or were not held for the minimum length
31 of time required pursuant to K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 58-4904, and amendments
32 thereto. Contributions to, or earnings from, such account shall also include
33 any amount resulting from the account holder not designating a surviving
34 payable on death beneficiary pursuant to K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 58-4904(e),
35 and amendments thereto.

36 (c) There shall be subtracted from federal adjusted gross income:

37 (i) Interest or dividend income on obligations or securities of any
38 authority, commission or instrumentality of the United States and its
39 possessions less any related expenses directly incurred in the purchase of
40 such obligations or securities, to the extent included in federal adjusted
41 gross income but exempt from state income taxes under the laws of the
42 United States.

43 (ii) Any amounts received which are included in federal adjusted

1 gross income but which are specifically exempt from Kansas income
2 taxation under the laws of the state of Kansas.

3 (iii) The portion of any gain or loss from the sale or other disposition
4 of property having a higher adjusted basis for Kansas income tax purposes
5 than for federal income tax purposes on the date such property was sold or
6 disposed of in a transaction in which gain or loss was recognized for
7 purposes of federal income tax that does not exceed such difference in
8 basis, but if a gain is considered a long-term capital gain for federal
9 income tax purposes, the modification shall be limited to that portion of
10 such gain which is included in federal adjusted gross income.

11 (iv) The amount necessary to prevent the taxation under this act of
12 any annuity or other amount of income or gain which was properly
13 included in income or gain and was taxed under the laws of this state for a
14 taxable year prior to the effective date of this act, as amended, to the
15 taxpayer, or to a decedent by reason of whose death the taxpayer acquired
16 the right to receive the income or gain, or to a trust or estate from which
17 the taxpayer received the income or gain.

18 (v) The amount of any refund or credit for overpayment of taxes on
19 or measured by income or fees or payments in lieu of income taxes
20 imposed by this state, or any taxing jurisdiction, to the extent included in
21 gross income for federal income tax purposes.

22 (vi) Accumulation distributions received by a taxpayer as a
23 beneficiary of a trust to the extent that the same are included in federal
24 adjusted gross income.

25 (vii) Amounts received as annuities under the federal civil service
26 retirement system from the civil service retirement and disability fund and
27 other amounts received as retirement benefits in whatever form which
28 were earned for being employed by the federal government or for service
29 in the armed forces of the United States.

30 (viii) Amounts received by retired railroad employees as a
31 supplemental annuity under the provisions of 45 U.S.C. §§ 228b(a) and
32 228c(a)(1) et seq.

33 (ix) Amounts received by retired employees of a city and by retired
34 employees of any board of such city as retirement allowances pursuant to
35 K.S.A. 13-14,106, and amendments thereto, or pursuant to any charter
36 ordinance exempting a city from the provisions of K.S.A. 13-14,106, and
37 amendments thereto.

38 (x) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 1976, the amount
39 of the federal tentative jobs tax credit disallowance under the provisions of
40 26 U.S.C. § 280C. For taxable years ending after December 31, 1978, the
41 amount of the targeted jobs tax credit and work incentive credit
42 disallowances under 26 U.S.C. § 280C.

43 (xi) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 1986, dividend

1 income on stock issued by Kansas venture capital, inc.

2 (xii) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 1989, amounts
3 received by retired employees of a board of public utilities as pension and
4 retirement benefits pursuant to K.S.A. 13-1246, 13-1246a and 13-1249,
5 and amendments thereto.

6 (xiii) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2004, amounts
7 contributed to and the amount of income earned on contributions deposited
8 to an individual development account under K.S.A. 74-50,201 et seq., and
9 amendments thereto.

10 (xiv) For all taxable years commencing after December 31, 1996, that
11 portion of any income of a bank organized under the laws of this state or
12 any other state, a national banking association organized under the laws of
13 the United States, an association organized under the savings and loan
14 code of this state or any other state, or a federal savings association
15 organized under the laws of the United States, for which an election as an
16 S corporation under subchapter S of the federal internal revenue code is in
17 effect, which accrues to the taxpayer who is a stockholder of such
18 corporation and which is not distributed to the stockholders as dividends of
19 the corporation. For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2012, and
20 ending before January 1, 2017, the amount of modification under this
21 subsection shall exclude the portion of income or loss reported on schedule
22 E and included on line 17 of the taxpayer's form 1040 federal individual
23 income tax return.

24 (xv) ~~For all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2017,~~ The
25 cumulative amounts not exceeding \$3,000, or \$6,000 for a married couple
26 filing a joint return, for each designated beneficiary that are contributed to:
27 (1) A family postsecondary education savings account established under
28 the Kansas postsecondary education savings program or a qualified tuition
29 program established and maintained by another state or agency or
30 instrumentality thereof pursuant to section 529 of the internal revenue
31 code of 1986, as amended, for the purpose of paying the qualified higher
32 education expenses of a designated beneficiary; or (2) an achieving a
33 better life experience (ABLE) account established under the Kansas ABLE
34 savings program or a qualified ABLE program established and maintained
35 by another state or agency or instrumentality thereof pursuant to section
36 529A of the internal revenue code of 1986, as amended, for the purpose of
37 saving private funds to support an individual with a disability. The terms
38 and phrases used in this paragraph shall have the meaning respectively
39 ascribed thereto by the provisions of K.S.A. 75-643 and 75-652, and
40 amendments thereto, and the provisions of such sections are hereby
41 incorporated by reference for all purposes thereof. *For all taxable years*
42 *beginning after December 31, 2022, contributions made to a qualified*
43 *tuition program account or a qualified ABLE program account pursuant*

1 *to this paragraph on and after January 1 but prior to the date required for*
2 *filing a return pursuant to K.S.A. 79-3221, and amendments thereto, of the*
3 *successive taxable year may be elected by the taxpayer to apply to the*
4 *prior taxable year if such election is made at the time of filing the return.*
5 *No contribution shall be used as a modification pursuant to this*
6 *paragraph in more than one taxable year.*

7 (xvi) For all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2004,
8 amounts received by taxpayers who are or were members of the armed
9 forces of the United States, including service in the Kansas army and air
10 national guard, as a recruitment, sign up or retention bonus received by
11 such taxpayer as an incentive to join, enlist or remain in the armed services
12 of the United States, including service in the Kansas army and air national
13 guard, and amounts received for repayment of educational or student loans
14 incurred by or obligated to such taxpayer and received by such taxpayer as
15 a result of such taxpayer's service in the armed forces of the United States,
16 including service in the Kansas army and air national guard.

17 (xvii) For all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2004,
18 amounts received by taxpayers who are eligible members of the Kansas
19 army and air national guard as a reimbursement pursuant to K.S.A. 48-
20 281, and amendments thereto, and amounts received for death benefits
21 pursuant to K.S.A. 48-282, and amendments thereto, to the extent that
22 such death benefits are included in federal adjusted gross income of the
23 taxpayer.

24 (xviii) For the taxable year beginning after December 31, 2006,
25 amounts received as benefits under the federal social security act which
26 are included in federal adjusted gross income of a taxpayer with federal
27 adjusted gross income of \$50,000 or less, whether such taxpayer's filing
28 status is single, head of household, married filing separate or married filing
29 jointly; and for all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2007,
30 amounts received as benefits under the federal social security act which
31 are included in federal adjusted gross income of a taxpayer with federal
32 adjusted gross income of \$75,000 or less, whether such taxpayer's filing
33 status is single, head of household, married filing separate or married filing
34 jointly.

35 (xix) Amounts received by retired employees of Washburn university
36 as retirement and pension benefits under the university's retirement plan.

37 (xx) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2012, and
38 ending before January 1, 2017, the amount of any: (1) Net profit from
39 business as determined under the federal internal revenue code and
40 reported from schedule C and on line 12 of the taxpayer's form 1040
41 federal individual income tax return; (2) net income, not including
42 guaranteed payments as defined in section 707(c) of the federal internal
43 revenue code and as reported to the taxpayer from federal schedule K-1,

1 (form 1065-B), in box 9, code F or as reported to the taxpayer from federal
2 schedule K-1, (form 1065) in box 4, from rental real estate, royalties,
3 partnerships, S corporations, estates, trusts, residual interest in real estate
4 mortgage investment conduits and net farm rental as determined under the
5 federal internal revenue code and reported from schedule E and on line 17
6 of the taxpayer's form 1040 federal individual income tax return; and (3)
7 net farm profit as determined under the federal internal revenue code and
8 reported from schedule F and on line 18 of the taxpayer's form 1040
9 federal income tax return; all to the extent included in the taxpayer's
10 federal adjusted gross income. For purposes of this subsection, references
11 to the federal form 1040 and federal schedule C, schedule E, and schedule
12 F, shall be to such form and schedules as they existed for tax year 2011
13 and as revised thereafter by the internal revenue service.

14 (xxi) For all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2013,
15 amounts equal to the unreimbursed travel, lodging and medical
16 expenditures directly incurred by a taxpayer while living, or a dependent
17 of the taxpayer while living, for the donation of one or more human organs
18 of the taxpayer, or a dependent of the taxpayer, to another person for
19 human organ transplantation. The expenses may be claimed as a
20 subtraction modification provided for in this section to the extent the
21 expenses are not already subtracted from the taxpayer's federal adjusted
22 gross income. In no circumstances shall the subtraction modification
23 provided for in this section for any individual, or a dependent, exceed
24 \$5,000. As used in this section, "human organ" means all or part of a liver,
25 pancreas, kidney, intestine, lung or bone marrow. The provisions of this
26 paragraph shall take effect on the day the secretary of revenue certifies to
27 the director of the budget that the cost for the department of revenue of
28 modifications to the automated tax system for the purpose of
29 implementing this paragraph will not exceed \$20,000.

30 (xxii) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2012, and
31 ending before January 1, 2017, the amount of net gain from the sale of: (1)
32 Cattle and horses, regardless of age, held by the taxpayer for draft,
33 breeding, dairy or sporting purposes, and held by such taxpayer for 24
34 months or more from the date of acquisition; and (2) other livestock,
35 regardless of age, held by the taxpayer for draft, breeding, dairy or
36 sporting purposes, and held by such taxpayer for 12 months or more from
37 the date of acquisition. The subtraction from federal adjusted gross income
38 shall be limited to the amount of the additions recognized under the
39 provisions of subsection (b)(xix) attributable to the business in which the
40 livestock sold had been used. As used in this paragraph, the term
41 "livestock" shall not include poultry.

42 (xxiii) For all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2012,
43 amounts received under either the Overland Park, Kansas police

1 department retirement plan or the Overland Park, Kansas fire department
2 retirement plan, both as established by the city of Overland Park, pursuant
3 to the city's home rule authority.

4 (xxiv) For taxable years beginning after December 31, 2013, and
5 ending before January 1, 2017, the net gain from the sale from Christmas
6 trees grown in Kansas and held by the taxpayer for six years or more.

7 (xxv) For all taxable years commencing after December 31, 2020,
8 100% of global intangible low-taxed income under section 951A of the
9 federal internal revenue code of 1986, before any deductions allowed
10 under section 250(a)(1)(B) of such code.

11 (xxvi) For all taxable years commencing after December 31, 2020,
12 the amount disallowed as a deduction pursuant to section 163(j) of the
13 federal internal revenue code of 1986, as in effect on January 1, 2018.

14 (xxvii) For taxable years commencing after December 31, 2020, the
15 amount disallowed as a deduction pursuant to section 274 of the federal
16 internal revenue code of 1986 for meal expenditures shall be allowed to
17 the extent such expense was deductible for determining federal income tax
18 and was allowed and in effect on December 31, 2017.

19 (xxviii) For all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2021: (1)
20 The amount contributed to a first-time home buyer savings account
21 pursuant to K.S.A. 2023 Supp. 58-4903, and amendments thereto, in an
22 amount not to exceed \$3,000 for an individual or \$6,000 for a married
23 couple filing a joint return; or (2) amounts received as income earned from
24 assets in a first-time home buyer savings account. *For all taxable years*
25 *beginning after December 31, 2022, contributions made to a first-time*
26 *home buyer savings account pursuant to subparagraph (1) on and after*
27 *January 1 but prior to the date required for filing a return pursuant to*
28 *K.S.A. 79-3221, and amendments thereto, of the successive taxable year*
29 *may be elected by the taxpayer to apply to the prior taxable year if such*
30 *election is made at the time of filing the return. No contribution shall be*
31 *used as a modification pursuant to subparagraph (1) in more than one*
32 *taxable year.*

33 (d) There shall be added to or subtracted from federal adjusted gross
34 income the taxpayer's share, as beneficiary of an estate or trust, of the
35 Kansas fiduciary adjustment determined under K.S.A. 79-32,135, and
36 amendments thereto.

37 (e) The amount of modifications required to be made under this
38 section by a partner which relates to items of income, gain, loss, deduction
39 or credit of a partnership shall be determined under K.S.A. 79-32,131, and
40 amendments thereto, to the extent that such items affect federal adjusted
41 gross income of the partner.
