2	Be i	t enac	ted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→ S	ection 1. KRS 158.162 is amended to read as follows:
4	(1)	Asι	used in this section:
5		(a)	"Emergency management response plan" or "emergency plan" means a
6			written document to prevent, mitigate, prepare for, respond to, and recover
7			from emergencies; and
8		(b)	"First responders" means local fire, police, and emergency medical personnel.
9	(2)	(a)	Each local board of education shall require the school council or, if none
10			exists, the principal in each school building in its jurisdiction to adopt an
11			emergency plan. The emergency plan shall include:
12			1. Procedures to be followed in case of medical emergency, fire, severe
13			weather, earthquake, or a building lockdown as defined in KRS
14			158.164;
15			2. A written cardiac emergency response plan; and
16			3. A diagram of the facility that clearly identifies the location of each
17			automated external defibrillator.
18		(b)	The emergency plan shall be provided to appropriate first responders and all
19			school staff.
20		(c)	The emergency plan shall be reviewed following the end of each school year
21			by the school nurse, school council, the principal, and first responders and
22			revised as needed.
23		(d)	The principal shall discuss the emergency plan with all school staff prior to
24			the first instructional day of each school year and document the time and date
25			of any discussion.
26		(e)	The cardiac emergency response plan shall be rehearsed by simulation prior to
27			the beginning of each athletic season by all:

1			1. Licensed athletic trainers, school nurses, and athletic directors; and
2			2. Interscholastic coaches and volunteer coaches of each athletic team
3			active during that athletic season.
4		(f)	The emergency plan shall be excluded from the application of KRS 61.870 to
5			51.884.
6	(3)	Each	local board of education shall require the school council or, if none exists, the
7		princ	pal in each school building to:
8		(a)	Establish primary and secondary evacuation routes for all rooms located
9			within the school and shall post the routes in each room by any doorway used
10			for evacuation;
11		(b)	Identify the best available severe weather safe zones, in consultation with
12			local and state safety officials and informed by guiding principles set forth by
13			the National Weather Service and the Federal Emergency Management
14			Agency, and post the location of safe zones in each room of the school;
15		(c)	Develop practices for students to follow during an earthquake;
16		(d)	Develop and adhere to practices to control the access to each school building.
17			Practices shall include but not be limited to:
18			1. Controlling outside access to exterior doors during the school day;
19			2. Controlling the main entrance of the school with electronically locking
20			doors, a camera, and an intercom system;
21			3. Controlling access to individual classrooms;
22			4. Requiring classroom doors to be equipped with hardware that allows the
23			door to be locked from the outside but opened from the inside;
24			5. Requiring classroom doors to remain closed and locked during
25			instructional time, except:
26			a. In instances in which only one (1) student and one (1) adult are in
27			the classroom; or

1		b. when approved in writing by the state school security marshal;
2		6. Requiring classroom doors with windows to be equipped with material
3		to quickly cover the window during a building lockdown;
4		7. Requiring all visitors to report to the front office of the building, provide
5		valid identification, and state the purpose of the visit; and
6		8. Providing a visitor's badge to be visibly displayed on a visitor's outer
7		garment;
8	(e)	Maintain a portable automated external defibrillator in a public, readily
9		accessible, well-marked location in every[middle and high] school building
10		and, as funds become available, at school-sanctioned[middle and high school]
11		athletic practices and competitions and:
12		1. Adopt procedures for the use of the portable automated external
13		defibrillator during an emergency;
14		2. Adopt policies for compliance with KRS 311.665 to 311.669 on
15		training, maintenance, notification, and communication with the local
16		emergency medical services system;
17		3. Ensure that a minimum of three (3) employees in the school and all
18		interscholastic athletic coaches be trained on the use of a portable
19		automated external defibrillator in accordance with KRS 311.667;[and]
20		4. Ensure that all interscholastic athletic coaches maintain a
21		cardiopulmonary resuscitation certification recognized by a national
22		accrediting body on heart health; and
23		5. No later than November 1 of each school year, submit an annual
24		report to the Kentucky Department of Education on:
25		a. The number and location of each portable automated external
26		defibrillator in every school building;
27		b. The name, school, and training date of each school district

1			employee and interscholastic athletic coach in the district trained
2			in the use of a portable automated external defibrillator; and
3			c. The progress made towards having a portable automated
4			external defibrillator at all school-sanctioned athletic practices
5			and competitions; and
6		(f)	Require development of an event-specific emergency action plan for each
7			school-sanctioned nonathletic event held off-campus to be used during a
8			medical emergency, which may include the provision of a portable automated
9			external defibrillator. The plan shall:
10			1. Include a delineation of the roles of staff and emergency personnel,
11			methods of communication, any assigned emergency equipment
12			including a portable automated external defibrillator, a cardiac
13			emergency response plan, and access to and plan for emergency
14			transport; and
15			2. Be in writing and distributed to any member of school personnel
16			attending the school-sanctioned event in an official capacity.
17	(4)	All	schools shall be in compliance with the provisions of subsection (3)(d) of this
18		sect	ion no later than July 1, 2022.
19	(5)	(a)	Each local board of education shall require the principal in each public school
20			building in its jurisdiction to conduct, at a minimum, emergency response
21			drills to include:
22			1. One (1) severe weather drill, one (1) earthquake drill, and one (1)
23			lockdown drill within the first thirty (30) instructional days of each
24			school year and again during the month of January; and
25			2. The emergency response plan rehearsal by simulation required by
26			subsection (2) of this section and the venue-specific emergency action
27			plan rehearsal by simulation required by KRS 160.445(5) prior to the

1		beginning of each athletic season.
2		(b) Required fire drills shall be conducted according to administrative regulations
3		promulgated by the Department of Housing, Buildings and Construction.
4		Whenever possible, first responders shall be invited to observe emergency
5		response drills.
6	(6)	No later than November 1 of each school year, a local district superintendent shall
7		send verification to the Kentucky Department of Education that all schools within
8		the district are in compliance with the requirements of this section.
9	(7)	A district with a school not in compliance with the requirements of subsection
10		(3)(d) of this section by July 1, 2022, shall not be eligible for approval by the
11		Kentucky Department of Education for new building construction or expansion in
12		the 2022-2023 school year and any subsequent year without verification of
13		compliance, except for facility improvements that specifically address the school
14		safety and security requirements of this section, when deemed necessary for the
15		protection of student or staff health and safety, or to comply with other legal
16		requirements or orders.
17		→ Section 2. KRS 158.1622 is amended to read as follows:
18	(1)	There is hereby created a trust and agency account to be known as the school AED
19		fund to be administered by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, in
20		collaboration with the Department of Education. Amounts deposited in the fund
21		shall be used for the purpose of awarding needs-based grants to public schools for:
22		(a) The purchase and maintenance of portable automated external defibrillators
23		and other medical devices used to diagnose, prevent, or treat a medical
24		condition that is harmful to student athletes; and
25		(b) The provision of cardiopulmonary resuscitation training.
26	(2)	The school AED fund shall consist of any:
27		(a) Appropriations designated for the fund;

1 Funds, grants, and receipts from fundraising activities on behalf of the fund; 2 and 3 Other moneys made available for the purposes of the fund. 4 (3) Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, fund amounts not expended at the close of a fiscal 5 year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward into the next fiscal year. 6 (4) Any interest earnings of the fund shall become a part of the fund and shall not 7 lapse. 8 (5) Moneys deposited in the fund are hereby appropriated for the purposes set forth in 9 this section and shall not be appropriated or transferred by the General Assembly 10 for any other purposes. 11 Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to restrict the ability of a school or (6) 12 school district to accept direct private donations for the purchase or maintenance of 13 an automated external defibrillator or other medical device used to diagnose, 14 prevent, or treat a medical condition that is harmful to student athletes.
