<u>MEASURE'S PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of the measure is to amend the 2016-2018 executive branch budget bill by restoring two portions of language from the Free Conference Committee Report that were line-item vetoed by the Governor after the 2016 Regular Session.

PROVISIONS/MECHANICS: Section 1 inserts language increasing the preschool eligibility threshold for four-year-olds to 200 percent of the federal poverty level as a pilot program for the 2016-2018 fiscal biennium.

Section 2 designates \$500,000 of the Department for Public Health appropriation in fiscal year 2017-2018 to the Kentucky Colon Cancer Screening Program. It also designates \$1,000,000 of the Department for Public Health appropriation in fiscal year 2017-2018 for the Kentucky Cancer Program to increase the number of women receiving breast and cervical cancer screenings. For each of these cancer screening programs, Section 2 requires the Department for

Public Health to submit a report on various aspects of the program to the Interim Joint Committee on Health and Welfare by September 1 of each year.

FISCAL EXPLANATION: No changes were made to any appropriation line within the 2016-2018 executive branch budget bill; therefore, the Department for Public Health would be required to redirect existing resources to accommodate these cancer screening programs. The Department of Education would distribute its existing preschool funds for fiscal year 2017-2018 based on the new enrollment numbers.
