PURPOSE OF MEASURE: House Bill 319 creates a new section of KRS 164 to establish the KentuckyCYBER program and fund. Postsecondary institutions may choose to participate in the program. The program’s purpose is to assist participating postsecondary institutions with the following mandates: training a skilled cybersecurity workforce, offering resources to government and economic sectors, fostering economic development through cybersecurity initiatives, creating an innovation ecosystem, establishing research centers, and providing nonpartisan advice to policymakers.

FISCAL EXPLANATION: Costs related to the KentuckyCYBER program are indeterminable and will rely on future contributions, grants, and appropriations from the General Assembly. The measure allows the Council on Postsecondary Education the authority to hire staff, contract for services, expend funds, and operate the normal business activities of the program. The Council estimates the costs of administering the program to be \$436,000 a year.
