1	AN ACT proposing an amendment to Section 226 of the Constitution of Kentucky

3 Be	it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	\Rightarrow Section 1. It is proposed that Section 226 of the Constitution of Kentucky be
5 am	ended to read as follows:
6	(1) The General Assembly may establish a Kentucky state lottery and may establish
7 a st	tate lottery to be conducted in cooperation with other states. Any lottery so established
8 sha	Il be operated by or on behalf of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
9	(2) The General Assembly may by general law permit charitable lotteries and
10 cha	aritable gift enterprises and, if it does so, it shall:
11	(a) Define what constitutes a charity or charitable organization;
12	(b) Define the types of charitable lotteries and charitable gift enterprises which may
13 be	engaged in;
14	(c) Set standards for the conduct of charitable lotteries and charitable gift
15 ent	erprises by charitable organizations;
16	(d) Provide for means of accounting for the amount of money raised by lotteries
17 and	l gift enterprises and for assuring its expenditure only for charitable purposes;
18	(e) Provide suitable penalties for violation of statutes relating to charitable lotteries
19 and	l charitable gift enterprises; and
20	(f) Pass whatever other general laws the General Assembly deems necessary to
21 ass	ure the proper functioning, honesty, and integrity of charitable lotteries and charitable
22 gift	t enterprises, and the charitable purposes for which the funds are expended.
23	(3) The General Assembly may by general law define and permit casino gaming
24 <u>and</u>	d, if it does so, it shall:
25	(a) Provide for the oversight and control of casino gaming by an administrative
26 <u>boa</u>	ly funded by license fees and taxes levied on casino gaming; and
27	(b) Prior to the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2038, allocate one hundred percent

(100%) of the proceeds generated from licensing fees and taxation of casinos and
casino gaming in excess of the amount required by paragraph (a) of this subsection to
the Kentucky Employees Retirement System nonhazardous pension fund, the Kentucky
Employees Retirement System hazardous pension fund, and the Kentucky Teachers'
Retirement System pension fund in amounts the General Assembly determines best
meet the needs of the respective funds at that time.

7 (4)[(3)] Except as provided in this section, lotteries and gift enterprises are 8 forbidden, and no privileges shall be granted for such purposes, and none shall be 9 exercised, and no schemes for similar purposes shall be allowed. The General Assembly 10 shall enforce this section by proper penalties. All lottery privileges or charters heretofore 11 granted are revoked.

Section 2. This amendment shall be submitted to the voters of the Commonwealth for their ratification or rejection at the time and in the manner provided for under Sections 256 and 257 of the Constitution and under KRS 118.415. The question to be submitted to the voters regarding this proposed amendment shall read: "Are you in favor of amending the Kentucky Constitution to allow the General Assembly to permit casino gaming if the proceeds are allocated to the public pension system for a twenty-year period?".
