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1	AN ACT relating to informed consent for medical examinations.	
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:	
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 216 IS CREATED TO	
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:	
5	(1) As used in this section, "informed consent" means the signing of a medical	
6	examination consent form by the patient or a person authorized to make health	
7	care decisions for the patient that satisfies the following conditions:	
8	(a) Is written in plain language or is communicated by a method the patient or	
9	person authorized to make health care decisions for the patient is able to	
10	<u>understand;</u>	
11	(b) Is dated;	
12	(c) Includes a description of the procedure to be performed; and	
13	(d) States whether a student or medical resident will perform or be present at	
14	the patient's examination.	
15	(2) A health care provider shall not knowingly perform or supervise the performance	
16	of a pelvic, rectal, or prostate examination on a patient who is anesthetized,	
17	unconscious, undergoing a prenatal visit, or giving birth unless one of the	
18	following applies:	
19	(a) The patient or the person authorized to make health care decisions for the	
20	patient has given informed consent to the examination;	
21	(b) The examination is necessary for diagnostic or treatment purposes;	
22	(c) An emergency exists that makes it impracticable to obtain informed consent	
23	and the examination is necessary for diagnostic or treatment purposes; or	
24	(d) A court of competent jurisdiction orders the performance of the	
25	examination for the collection of evidence and the order is issued in	
26	compliance with all of the following provisions:	
27	1. The court finds that there is a compelling need for the examination	

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1	that cannot be accommodated by	other means. In assessing	
2	compelling need, the court shall weigh the need for the examination		
3	and the disclosure of the results against the privacy interest of the		
4	individual to be examined; and		
5	2. Pleadings pertaining to the ordering of the examination shall		
6	substitute a pseudonym for the true name of the subject of the		
7	examination. The true name shall be communicated confidentially to		
8	the court and kept under seal of the co	<u>ırt.</u>	
9	(3) A health care provider shall notify the patient as s	oon as reasonably practical that	
10	an examination was performed.		
11	(4) A health care provider who violates subsection (2) of this section shall be subject	
12	to discipline by the appropriate professional licens	ing or certification board.
