| 3 | →SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 620 IS CREATED TO |
| 4 | READ AS FOLLOWS: |
| 5 | (1) If the cabinet's initial determination as to the risk of harm to and immediate |
| 6 | safety of an abused or neglected child as defined in KRS 600.020 requires an |
| 7 | investigation pursuant to administrative regulations promulgated by the cabinet, |
| 8 | including consideration of information on the nature and extent of a present |
| 9 | danger or threat of danger to the child or cabinet staff, and if the investigation |
| 10 | requires a visit to the residence or location where the reported abuse or neglect |
| 11 | occurred, the cabinet shall make the visit unannounced, in addition to any other |
| 12 | actions taken to protect the child. |
| 13 | (2) If the initial visit is necessary, after it is completed, the cabinet shall incorporate |
| 14 | unannounced visits with any necessary scheduled visits until the welfare of the |
| 15 | child has been safeguarded in accordance with administrative regulations |
| 16 | promulgated by the cabinet. |
| 17 | (3) If there is reason to believe a child is in imminent danger, or if a parent or |
| 18 | caretaker of a child refuses the cabinet entry to a child's home or refuses to allow |
| 19 | a child to be interviewed, the cabinet may request assistance: |
| 20 | (a) From law enforcement; or |
| 21 | (b) Through a request for a court order pursuant to KRS 620.040(5)(a). |
| 22 | (4) A school or a child-care provider shall provide the cabinet access to a child |
| 23 | subject to an investigation without parental consent. |
