6		<u>(a)</u>	"Military healthcare personnel" means an individual who has received
7			formal training and practical experience in healthcare disciplines during
8			his or her military service. including providing emergency medical care,
9			preventive healthcare, and specialized medical services; and
10		<u>(b)</u>	"Professional licensure board" has the same meaning as in KRS 211.332.
11	<u>(2)</u>	(a)	The Kentucky Community and Technical College System shall develop
12			academic career pathways and integrated academic bridge programs for
13			military healthcare personnel that are designed to enable current and
14			former military healthcare personnel to achieve reduced time-to-credential
15			outcomes. These pathways and integrated academic bridge programs shall
16			integrate military academic and experiential learning to accelerate the
17			transition from military to civilian healthcare credentialing based on
18			developed military-to-civilian occupational crosswalks for, at a minimum,
19			the following occupations:
20			1. Infantryman;
21			2. Hospital Corpsman;
22			3. Biomedical Equipment Specialist;
23			4. Orthopedic Specialist;
24			5. Practical Nursing Specialist;
25			6. Operating Room Specialist;

20	<u>(b)</u>	The Kentucky Community and Technical College System military
21		healthcare personnel academic career pathways and integrated academic
22		bridge programs shall be fully compatible with the Department of Defense
23		SkillBridge program.
24	<u>(c)</u>	The Kentucky Community and Technical College System shall review
25		military healthcare personnel related healthcare programs in relationship to
26		realistic earning potential and employability of the institution graduates and
27		submit a written report to the Legislative Research Commission for referral

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1	to the Interim Joint Committee on Veterans, Military Affairs, and Public
2	Protection no later than September 1 of each year. The report shall include:
3	1. The minimum number of months or years required to complete the
4	healthcare program and the average number of months or years
5	military healthcare personnel graduates of each healthcare program
6	were enrolled;
7	2. The graduation rate of each healthcare program and the military
8	healthcare personnel graduation rate;
9	3. The employment rate of military healthcare personnel graduates of
10	each healthcare program within twelve (12) months of graduation;
11	<u>and</u>
12	4. A summary of all new actions taken by the institution during the
13	reporting year to increase military healthcare personnel participation
14	and to reduce transitional barriers to healthcare professionals.
15	(3) The Kentucky Community and Technical College System, in collaboration with
16	the United States Department of Labor, Kentucky veterans' organizations, the
17	Kentucky Department of Veterans Affairs, the Kentucky Department of Military
18	Affairs, and any other public or private entities, including state-based entities
19	transitioning military personnel to Kentucky-based employment, shall use
20	healthcare and military recruiters, as well as other dedicated resources, to
21	advocate, facilitate, and promote the recruitment and enrollment of military
22	healthcare personnel into military healthcare academic and career pathways.
23	(4) Each professional licensure board shall collaborate with the Kentucky
24	Community and Technical College System to integrate the academic career
25	pathways and integrated academic bridge programs for military healthcare
26	personnel into their licensure requirements.
