2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 12 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) An administrative body that issues a license, permit, certificate, or other
6	document required to operate within a business, profession, or other occupation
7	in the Commonwealth shall issue within thirty (30) days of receipt of a completed
8	application a license, permit, certificate, or other document to a United States
9	military service member or veteran who is seeking a license, permit, certificate, or
10	other document and currently holds or recently held equivalent documentation
11	issued by another state, the District of Columbia, or any possession or territory of
12	the United States unless:
13	(a) The license, permit, certificate, or other document issued by another state
14	the District of Columbia, or any possession or territory of the United States
15	has been expired for more than two (2) years;
16	(b) The license, permit, certificate, or other documentation is not in good
17	standing;
18	(c) The holder of the license, permit, certificate, or other document has had the
19	license, permit, certificate, or other document suspended for disciplinary
20	reasons; or
21	(d) The board can show substantive evidence of significant statutory deficiency
22	in the training, education, or experience of the United States military
23	service member or veteran, which could cause a health or safety risk to the
24	<u>public.</u>
25	(2) The United States military service member or veteran shall submit:
26	(a) Proof of issuance of a valid license, permit, certificate, or other document
27	issued by another state, the District of Columbia, or any possession or

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1		territory of the United States that is active or has been expired for less than
2		two (2) years;
3		(b) Proof that the valid license, permit, certificate, or other document issued by
4		another state, the District of Columbia, or any possession or territory of the
5		United States is in good standing or was upon the date of expiration; and
6		(c) His or her DD-214 form or other proof of active or prior military service
7		with an honorable discharge, discharge under honorable conditions, or a
8		general discharge under honorable conditions.
9	<u>(3)</u>	A United States military service member or veteran who holds a license, permit,
10		certificate, or other document issued by another state, the District of Columbia,
11		or any possession or territory of the United States who applies for a license,
12		permit, certificate, or other document pursuant to subsection (1) of this section
13		and is denied shall have the right to appeal the decision in accordance with KRS
14		Chapter 13B.

12		of the Commonwealth of Kentucky;
13	(8)	"Foreign business trust" means a business or statutory trust not governed as to its
14		internal affairs by KRS Chapter 386 or 386A;
15	(9)	"Foreign corporation" means a corporation as defined in subsection (2) of this
