15	proceeds which accrue to this fund pursuant to KRS 42.190 and 136.392. The fund
16	may also receive any other funds, gifts, or grants made available to the state for
17	distribution to local governments and volunteer fire departments in accordance with
18	the provisions of KRS 95A.200 to 95A.300 and KRS 95A.262.
19	(3)[(2)] All moneys remaining in this fund on July 1, 1982, and deposited thereafter
20	including earnings from their investment, shall be deemed a trust and agency
21	account. Beginning with the fiscal year 1994-95, through June 30, 1999, money
22	remaining in the account at the end of the fiscal year in excess of three million
23	dollars (\$3,000,000) shall lapse, but moneys in the revolving loan fund established
24	in KRS 95A.262 shall not lapse. On and after July 1, 1999, moneys in this account
25	shall not lapse.
26	(4)[(3)] Moneys in the fund are hereby appropriated by the General Assembly for the
27	purposes provided in KRS 95A.200 to 95A.300.
