9	m	arks on trees or posts on the property, if the marks are:
10	<u>(a</u>) Vertical lines of not less than eight (8) inches in length and not less than
11		one (1) inch in width;
12	<u>(b</u>) Placed so that the bottom of the mark is not less than three (3) feet from the
13		ground or more than five (5) feet from the ground; and
14	<u>(c</u>)	Placed at locations that are readily visible to any person approaching the
15		property and no more than:
16		1. One hundred (100) feet apart on forest land; or
17		2. One thousand (1,000) feet apart on land other than forest land.
