   the executive branch.
- 3 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- 4 → Section 1. KRS 56.463 is amended to read as follows:
- 5 The cabinet shall have the power and duty:
- 6 (1) To determine the comparative needs and demands of the various state agencies for
  7 acquiring real estate and for building projects;
- 8 (2) To purchase or otherwise acquire all real property determined to be needed for state 9 use and upon the approval of the secretary of the Finance and Administration 10 Cabinet as to the determination of need and as to the action of purchase or other 11 acquisition, except as provided in KRS Chapters 175, 176, 177, and 180. All such 12 acquisitions of real property or interests therein shall be made in accordance with 13 KRS 45A.045;
- 14 (3) To sell or otherwise dispose of all property, including any interest in real property,
  15 of the state that is not needed or has become unsuitable for public use or would be
  16 more suitable consistent with the public interest for some other use as determined
  17 by the secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet. All such sales or other
  18 disposition shall be made in accordance with KRS 45A.045;
- 19 (4)(a) To control the use of any real property owned or otherwise held by the 20 Commonwealth, or any state agency, and to determine for what periods of 21 time and for what purposes any state agency may use the same, including the 22 agency for whose use it was initially acquired or improved, and to determine 23 what appropriate uses shall be made of such real property during periods that 24 the cabinet finds the same is not required for the purposes of any particular 25 state agency. The cabinet shall allocate to the General Assembly and the 26 Legislative Research Commission *all*[the amount of] space within the New 27 State Capitol Annex[, currently assigned to the legislative branch] in the

1	basement and on the first, second, third, and fourth floors [ floor totaling
2	forty-nine thousand six hundred thirty-eight (49,638) square feet;
3	approximately twenty-four thousand four hundred fifty-two (24,452) square
4	feet on the second floor from an imaginary line running north and south down
5	the center of the center wing hallway of the building and all space to the east
6	<del>of this line]</del> , excluding <u>:</u>
7	<u>1.</u> Mechanical areas, public entrances, <i>vestibules</i> , and restrooms; <i>and</i>
8	2. The following additional space, as allocated on January 1, 2023:
9	a. Areas in the basement occupied by the Kentucky State Police and
10	Facilities Security;
11	b. Areas in the basement operated as the snack bar and cafeteria.
12	as well as storage areas related to the operation of the snack bar
13	and cafeteria;
14	c. The area in the basement operated as a nurse's station;
15	d. The area in the basement used as an automated teller machine
16	<u>(ATM);</u>
17	e. The office space in the basement occupied by the Secretary of
18	<u>State;</u>
19	f. Utility spaces in the basement west wing and east wing
20	northernmost hallways occupied by janitorial, maintenance, and
21	<u>mechanical staff;</u>
22	g. The loading dock in the rear of the annex basement, along with
23	the office space immediately adjacent to the loading dock on the
24	back wall of the annex, provided that the General Assembly and
25	the Legislative Research Commission shall be given access to
26	and use of the loading dock and the receiving areas adjacent to
27	the loading dock; and

1		h. Office and studio space on the first floor currently occupied and
2		used for broadcasting purposes by Kentucky Educational
3		<u><i>Television</i></u> [; approximately twenty-three thousand nine hundred
4		forty (23,940) square feet on the third floor from an imaginary line
5		running north and south down the center of the center wing
6		hallway of the building and all space to the east of this line,
7		excluding mechanical areas, public entrances, and restrooms;
8		approximately twenty two thousand fifty six (22,056) square feet
9		on the fourth floor from an imaginary line running north and south
10		down the center of the center wing hallway of the building and all
11		space to the east of this line, excluding mechanical areas, public
12		entrances, and restrooms].
13		All space assigned to the legislative branch and plans, uses, furnishings, and
14		equipment therefor are subject to the specific approval of the Legislative
15		Research Commission;
16	(b)	All additional space in the New State Capitol Annex, not specifically
17		allocated for use by the General Assembly and the Legislative Research
18		Commission in paragraph (a) of this subsection, shall be allocated for the use
19		of the legislative branch, with occupancy by the legislative branch to be
20		determined by the Legislative Research Commission, upon a[. Until the
21		Legislative Research Commission, by] vote of a majority of the[its] entire
22		membership of the Legislative Research Commission[, determines that the
23		legislative branch shall occupy all or part of such additional space in the
24		Capitol Annex, the cabinet shall continue to determine the occupancy of such
25		additional space];
26	(c)	[Forty percent (40%) of the floor space provided by paragraph (a) of this
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subsection for use by the legislative branch shall be assigned for the use of the

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1		Senate. Sixty percent (60%) of the floor space provided by paragraph (a) of
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		this subsection for use by the legislative branch shall be assigned for the use
3		of the House of Representatives; and
4	<del>(d)</del>	<u>]In order for the General Assembly and the Legislative Research</u>
5		Commission to efficiently utilize the space provided by paragraphs (a) and
6		(b) of this subsection, the cabinet shall enter into a memorandum of
7		understanding with the Legislative Research Commission on or about
8		February 1, 2024, and as often as every two (2) years thereafter at the
9		request of the Legislative Research Commission, to establish tenancy terms,
10		including but not limited to building maintenance, repairs, renovations, and
11		upgrades; facility security; janitorial services; and applicable rental and
12		utilities rates. The Legislative Research Commission shall at any time, and
13		upon at least sixty (60) days' notice, be authorized to discontinue the
14		cabinet's provision of janitorial services for the New State Capitol Annex
15		and to enter into a separate contract for the provision of those services, with
16		the applicable rental and utilities rates to be proportionately reduced to
17		reflect that separate contract, provided that the Legislative Research
18		Commission may also at any time, and upon at least sixty (60) days' notice,
19		elect to have the cabinet continue or reinstate the provision of those
20		janitorial services at the cabinet's expense;
21	<u>(d)</u>	For the purposes of this subsection, real property shall include the parking
22		areas adjacent to the New State Capitol and the New State Capitol Annex,
23		and the cabinet shall allocate to the General Assembly and the Legislative
24		Research Commission all parking spaces within the Capitol campus parking
25		garage, all parking spaces in the east, south, and west parking lots of the
26		New State Capitol Annex, and all parking spaces in the west parking lot of
27		the New State Capitol, except for those spaces in the west parking lot of the

- 1New State Capitol allocated, as of January 1, 2023, to the Supreme Court of2Kentucky, the Attorney General, and the Secretary of State. Any further3allocation of any parking spaces allocated pursuant to this paragraph shall4be within the sole discretion of the Legislative Research Commission or its5designee; and
- 6 *(e)* To determine the housing and furnishings needs of the various state agencies 7 located in Frankfort and to establish and put into effect a permanent program 8 for housing them. Subject to paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection, the 9 cabinet is also authorized and directed to allocate office space and furnishings 10 in existing public buildings located in Frankfort, exclusive of the third and 11 fourth floors of the New State Capitol and the space in the New State Capitol 12 Annex allocated to the legislative branch, according to the needs of the 13 various agencies. When necessary, the cabinet is authorized to provide 14 additional office space and furnishings in Frankfort under any building 15 program the cabinet deems most advisable and economical for the state. The permanent housing program shall include provisions for housing the General 16 17 Assembly and its related agencies, including the Legislative Research 18 Commission, and its subcommittees, the executive offices, the Supreme Court 19 and the clerk of the Supreme Court, the Department of Law and the law 20 library, in the New State Capitol, provided the General Assembly and the 21 Legislative Research Commission shall have complete control and exclusive 22 use of the third and fourth floors of the New State Capitol and shall have 23 exclusive use of the space in the New State Capitol Annex allocated to them 24 under paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection. If there be any additional 25 space in the Capitol, it shall be assigned to agencies whose activities are most 26 closely related to the agencies directed to be located permanently in the 27 Capitol;

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- (5) To acquire, by condemnation in the manner provided in the Eminent Domain Act of
   Kentucky, any real estate necessary for use by the state or by any state agency,
   when the cabinet is unable to agree with the owner thereof on a price for such real
   estate;
- 5 (6) To lease any real property, or any interest in such real property, owned by the state
  6 or any agency thereof, in accordance with KRS 45A.045;
- 7 (7)To provide for and adopt plans and specifications as may be necessary, to provide 8 adequate public notice for and receive bids for any expenditures proposed to be 9 made, to award contracts for the purpose authorized, to supervise construction and 10 make changes and revisions in plans and specifications or in construction as may 11 become necessary, and generally to do any and all other things as may become 12 necessary or expedient in order to effectively fulfill and carry out the purposes of 13 this chapter, including the right to employ clerks, engineers, statisticians, architects, 14 or other persons required to be employed in order to fulfill the functions of the 15 Commonwealth relating to state property and buildings provided in KRS 56.450 to 16 56.550; and
- 17 (8) To adopt rules and promulgate administrative regulations as may be necessary to
  18 govern the acquisition, control, and disposition of the real property to which this
  19 section is applicable.
