3		→ S	ection 1. KRS 72.450 is amended to read as follows:
4	(1)	<u>(a)</u>	A coroner who has possession of a dead body or a part thereof shall make a
5			bona fide attempt to notify the spouse, if any, or next of kin of the decedent's
6			death. In the event the coroner is unable to locate the spouse, if any, or next of
7			kin, he or she may cause the body to be buried or cremated at the expense of
8			the fiscal court, consolidated local government, or urban-county government,
9			whichever is appropriate.
10		<u>(b)</u>	After cremation, the coroner shall either:
11			1. Offer the cremated remains to the spouse, if any, next of kin, or friend
12			of the decedent, if any are discovered; or
13			2. Inter the cremated remains of the decedent at the expense of the fiscal
14			court, consolidated local government, or urban-county government. If
15			a coroner inters the cremated remains, the interment shall be
16			accompanied by the placement of a permanent marker with the
17			decedent's name and dates of birth and death, if known.
18		<u>(c)</u>	For the purposes of this section, "inter," "inters," "interred," or
19			"interment" means burial, entombment, or inurnment in any cemetery,
20			place of sepulture, mausoleum, crypt, or columbarium, in a manner
21			consistent with a proper and dignified disposition commonly associated with
22			a final resting place for human cremated remains.
23	(2)	In th	ne event the body is buried, <i>cremated</i> , <i>or interred</i> at public expense, the coroner
24		shal	I take possession of all money or other property found on or belonging to the
25		dece	edent and shall deliver same to the fiscal court, consolidated local government,
26		or ı	urban-county government, whichever is appropriate. Any money or other

property found on the body of the decedent or belonging to him or her shall be

1		delivered by the coroner to the fiscal court, consolidated local government, or
2		urban-county government, whichever is appropriate, to help defray burial,
3		<u>cremation</u> , or <u>interment</u> expenses. Any excess funds shall escheat to such
4		governmental agency one (1) year thereafter.
5	(3)	In lieu of having an unclaimed body buried at public expense, the coroner may
6		deliver such body or part thereof to a state medical school in accordance with the
7		provisions of KRS 311.300 to 311.350.
8	<u>(4)</u>	No cremation shall occur for any unclaimed body for which the coroner:
9		(a) 1. Has held or intends to hold a coroners' inquest in accordance with
10		<u>KRS 72.420; and</u>
11		2. Has any reason to believe that the unclaimed body will be needed as
12		evidence in any criminal matter; or
13		(b) Upon reasonable inquiry, believes cremation is or may be inconsistent with
14		the personal wishes of the decedent or his or her cultural or religious
15		beliefs.
