6	<u>(1)</u>	The General Assembly finds that a proposed amendment of 803 KAR 25:190,
7		relating to utilization review and medical bill audits, filed with the Commission
8		on February 18, 2021, by the Labor Cabinet, Department of Workers' Claims,
9		was found deficient on or after March 30, 2021, and before January 4, 2022, but
10		determined to become effective notwithstanding the finding of deficiency
11		pursuant to KRS 13A.330, as evidenced by records of the Legislative Research
12		Commission.
13	<u>(2)</u>	Contrary provisions of any section of the Kentucky Revised Statutes
14		notwithstanding:
15		(a) If the proposed amendment of 803 KAR 25:190 referenced in subsection (1)
16		of this section has not been adopted on or before the effective date of this
17		Act, the proposed amendment shall expire as of the effective date of this
18		Act; or
19		(b) If the proposed amendment of 803 KAR 25:190 referenced in subsection (1)
20		of this section has been adopted on or before the effective date of this Act,
21		803 KAR 25:190 shall be null, void, and unenforceable as of the effective
22		date of this Act.
23	<u>(3)</u>	Contrary provisions of any section of the Kentucky Revised Statutes
24		notwithstanding, the administrative body shall be prohibited from promulgating
25		an administrative regulation that is identical to, or substantially the same as, the
26		proposed amendment of 803 KAR 25:190 referenced in subsection (1) of this
27		section for a period beginning on January 4, 2022, and concluding on June 1,

9		2021, and before the effective date of this Act, as evidenced by the records of the
10		Legislative Research Commission.
11	<u>(2)</u>	Contrary provisions of any section of the Kentucky Revised Statutes
12		notwithstanding, the administrative regulation referenced in subsection (1) of
13		this section shall be null, void, and unenforceable as of the effective date of this
14		<u>Act.</u>
15	<u>(3)</u>	Contrary provisions of any section of the Kentucky Revised Statutes
16		notwithstanding, the administrative body shall be prohibited from promulgating
17		an administrative regulation that is identical to, or substantially the same as, the
18		administrative regulation referenced in subsection (1) of this section for a period
19		beginning on January 4, 2022, and concluding on June 1, 2023.
20	<i>(4)</i>	The administrative regulation referenced in subsection (1) of this section shall be
21		available to the public, in the office of the Legislative Research Commission's
