

1 A RESOLUTION adjourning the Senate in honor and loving memory of Janet Sue
2 Roundtree.

3 WHEREAS, Janet Roundtree was born May 28, 1946, in Jersey City, New Jersey,
4 to the late Edith Allen Bargo and William Joseph Scharf; and

5 WHEREAS, Janet Roundtree was united in marriage to Ray Roundtree of London,
6 Kentucky, on June 24, 1967, and remained happily married for over 56 years; and

7 WHEREAS, Janet Roundtree dedicated her career to educating the youth of the
8 Commonwealth, having spent her last 26 years of teaching at Johnson Elementary School
9 in London, Kentucky, before retiring; and

10 WHEREAS, Janet Roundtree was a charter member of Lick Fork Community
11 Baptist Church, a member of the Ladies Auxiliary of the London Gideon Camp, and a
12 member of both the Kentucky Retired Teachers Association and the Laurel County
13 Retired Teachers Local; and

14 WHEREAS, Janet Roundtree passed from this life to the next on March 9, 2024, at
15 the age of 77; and

16 WHEREAS, in addition to her parents, Janet Roundtree was preceded in death by
17 her grandparents, Leonard and Lydia Allen. She is survived by her husband, Ray
18 Roundtree; her son, Kyle (Carmen) Roundtree; her brother, Allen (Vivian) Scharf; her
19 niece, Kellie Laymon; her nephews, Scotty Scharf, Bryan Scharf, and Keaton Scharf; her
20 grandchild, Peyton Roundtree; and a host of relatives and friends who mourn her passing;
