1	A RESOLUTION adjourning the Senate in honor and loving memory of Albert
2	Perrine "Al" Smith Jr.
3	WHEREAS, this body pauses on this day to honor a titan of Kentucky journalism,
4	Albert Perrine "Al" Smith Jr.
5	WHEREAS, at 15 years of age, Al Smith beat out 100,000 contestants to win the
6	American Legion's national oratorical contest. He joined the United States Army during
7	World War II, and attended Vanderbilt University before beginning his long and
8	extraordinary career in journalism; and
9	WHEREAS, Al Smith served as an editor for the New Orleans Times-Picayune and
10	the States-Item before relocating to Russellville, Kentucky, to become the editor of the
11	News-Democrat; and
12	WHEREAS, it was in this Commonwealth that Al Smith's legacy as one of this
13	country's most venerable political reporters was formed; and
14	WHEREAS, Al Smith was host and producer of Kentucky Educational Television's
15	Comment on Kentucky, the longest-running public affairs program on a PBS station. The
16	program, which featured a panel of Kentucky journalists discussing and analyzing the
17	week's news, was an instrumental part of the political discourse in this Commonwealth
18	for more than three decades; and
19	WHEREAS, Al Smith was the founding chair of the Kentucky Oral History
20	Commission and chair of Leadership Kentucky and the Shakertown Roundtable. He was
21	the founder of the Institute for Rural Journalism and Community Issues, an organization
22	that gave rural journalists an avenue to define the public agenda in their communities; and
23	WHEREAS, Al Smith was a charter member of the Kentucky Journalism Hall of
24	Fame, a fellow of the National Society of Professional Journalists, the former president of
25	the Kentucky Press Association, and the former chairman of the Kentucky Arts
26	Commission. He was named a Distinguished Rural Kentuckian by the Kentucky
27	Association of Electric Cooperatives and a Rural Hero by the National Rural Assembly.

- 5 WHEREAS, a Kentuckian of the first order; a journalist who exemplified the very
- 6 best of his profession; and a cherished husband, father, grandfather, and brother, Al Smith
- 7 passed away peacefully at his home on March 19, 2021, and this august body pauses on
- 8 this day in rightful appreciation of his accomplishments; and
