

1 A RESOLUTION adjourning the Senate in honor and loving memory of Robert  
2 Willis Lindsey.

3 WHEREAS, Robert Lindsey was born in Pikeville, Kentucky on February 3, 1964,  
4 to the late Will Lindsey and Nancy May Lindsey Brandt; and

5 WHEREAS, Robert Lindsey served as a Pikeville fire fighter and instructor, and as  
6 an instructor for State Fire and Rescue Training Service; and

7 WHEREAS, Robert Lindsey was an exemplary and consummate public servant  
8 who worked to improve the lives of his fellow citizens and keep them safe; and

9 WHEREAS, Robert Lindsey was also a member of the Thomas C. Cecil Lodge, the  
10 El Hasa Shrine, and the Covington Scottish Rites; and

11 WHEREAS, Robert Lindsey passed from this life to the next, at the age of 60, on  
12 March 26, 2024, at the Pikeville Medical Center; and

13 WHEREAS, in addition to his parents, Robert Lindsey was preceded in death by his  
14 two sisters, Gina Leopold and Paget Ann McCoy. He is survived by his beloved wife of  
15 39 years, Kimberly Sturgill Lindsey; son, Robert (Holly) Lindsey; daughter, Beka  
16 Danielle Lindsey; step-mother, Karen Kinnard Lindsey; brother, Will Lindsey; and his  
17 sister, Kari (Darren) Messer; and

18 WHEREAS, Robert Lindsey leaves behind a legacy of public service, love for his  
19 family, and dedication to his community;
