5	WHEREAS, one in 285 children in the United States will be diagnosed by their
6	20th birthday; and
7	WHEREAS, 43 children per day or 15,780 children annually are diagnosed with
8	cancer in the United States; and
9	WHEREAS, there are approximately 40,000 children on active treatment at any
10	given time; and
11	WHEREAS, the average age of diagnosis is six years old, compared to 66 years for
12	adult cancer diagnosis; and
13	WHEREAS, 80 percent of childhood cancer patients are diagnosed late and with
14	metastatic disease; and
15	WHEREAS, on average, there's been a 0.6 percent increase in incidence per year
16	since the mid-1970s, resulting in an overall incidence increase of 24 percent over the last
17	40 years; and
18	WHEREAS, in Kentucky, through state funding researchers have discovered an 87
19	percent higher incidence of pediatric brain tumors—the leading cause of death in
20	pediatric cancer—in a 40-county area of the Commonwealth; and
21	WHEREAS, two-thirds of childhood cancer patients will have chronic health
22	conditions as a result of their treatment toxicity, with one-quarter being classified as
23	severe to life-threatening; and
24	WHEREAS, approximately one-half of childhood cancer families rate the
25	associated financial toxicity due to out-of-pocket expenses as considerable to severe; and
26	WHEREAS, in the last 20 years, only four new drugs have been approved by the
27	FDA to specifically treat childhood cancer; and
