Amendments proposed by House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice to Original House Bill No. 641 by Representative Guillory

1 AMENDMENT NO. 1

2 On page 1, line 2, after "(G)," and before "(J), insert "(I)(4),"

3 AMENDMENT NO. 2

4 On page 1, line 6, after "corrections;" and before "and" insert "to provide relative to
5 legislative approval of fees to defray the costs of administering the central computer
6 system;"

7 AMENDMENT NO. 3

8 On page 1, line 8, after "(G)," and before "(J), insert "(I)(4),"

9 AMENDMENT NO. 4

10 On page 2, between lines 7 and 8, insert the following:

11 "I. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of state police,
12 shall impose and collect an annual fee not in excess of fifty dollars on each electronic
13 gaming device linked by telecommunication to the central computer system as
14 provided by this Section. The purpose of the fee shall be to defray the costs to the
15 state of acquiring, implementing, and maintaining the central computer system as
16 provided for in this Section. The annual fee shall be established in an amount which
17 will generate an amount of funds in each fiscal year which is equal to the projected
18 cost of administering the system for that fiscal year. No additional fee shall be
19 imposed with respect to the central computer system. This fee shall be in addition
20 to any other fee provided for by this Chapter. The fee shall be subject to the
21 following provisions:

23 (4) ~~No~~ If the amount of the proposed fee exceeds by fifty percent the fee
24 imposed during the prior year or the sum of twenty-five dollars, the fee shall not be
25 imposed or collected unless the legislative committees with jurisdiction over gaming
26 matters as provided by legislative rule have found that the information and
27 documentation submitted by the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office
28 of state police, is sufficient to justify the amount of the proposed fee and those
29 committees have affirmatively approved the amount of the proposed fee."
