**Abstract:** Exempts the payment of expungement fees when the applicant possesses an industry-based certificate or a postsecondary education certificate, associate degree, or baccalaureate degree.

Present law provides that an applicant for expungement does not have to pay any fees for the expungement if the applicant has no felony convictions and no pending felony charges under a bill of information or indictment and at least one of the following applies:

- (1) The applicant was acquitted, after trial, of all charges derived from the arrest, including any lesser and included offense.
- (2) The district attorney consents, and the case against the applicant was dismissed or the district attorney declined to prosecute the case prior to the time limitations provided for in present law, and the applicant did not participate in a pretrial diversion program.
- (3) The applicant was arrested and was not prosecuted within the time limitations provided for in present law and did not participate in a pretrial diversion program.
- (4) The applicant was determined to be factually innocent and entitled to compensation for a wrongful conviction.
- (5) The applicant was determined to be a victim of unauthorized use of an "access card", identity theft, access device fraud, or a violation of any other crime which involves the unlawful use of the identity or personal information of the applicant.

Proposed law removes the reference of unauthorized use of an "access card" since this crime was repealed by Act No. 281 of the 2017 Regular Session.

Proposed law retains present law and adds an additional circumstance for the exemption of expungement fees when the applicant possesses an industry-based certificate or a postsecondary education certificate, associate degree, or baccalaureate degree.
