**Subject:** Penalties for operating a vehicle while intoxicated. **Analyst:** John McKay

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Provides relative to penalties for the crime of operating a vehicle while intoxicated. (7/1/24) (Item #16)

Related to operating a vehicle while intoxicated, <u>proposed law</u> changes the period a driver is required to have an ignition interlock device (IID) as follows: (1) 1st offense - <u>from</u> the first 12 months <u>to</u> the entire 2 year suspension period; and (2) 2nd offense - <u>from</u> the first 3 years <u>to</u> the entire 4 year suspension period. <u>Proposed law</u> changes the period <u>from</u> 6 <u>to</u> 12 months for an IID to remain on a motor vehicle from the date a restricted driver's license is granted for a third or subsequent offenses within 5 years from the date of the first offense. <u>Proposed law</u> changes the period <u>from</u> 90 days <u>to</u> 180 days from the date of suspension on first offense, for the suspension of driving privileges of a person that tested and results showed a blood alcohol level of 0.08% or above. <u>Proposed law</u> changes <u>present law</u> for persons eligible to be considered for a restricted license upon proof it would prevent the person from earning a livelihood: (1) <u>from</u> first refusal and first submission to a test <u>to</u> second refusal and a second test submission, (2) Adds requirement that the person's vehicle be equipped with an IID, (3) Removes the limitation for eligibility to persons who do not have a prior suspension.
