LICENSING: Provides for licensure of radiology practitioner assistants

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 37:3200(2)(introductory paragraph), 3207(B)(1),
3	3208(A)(introductory paragraph), 3211, 3212, 3213, 3214(introductory paragraph),
4	3216, 3219(A)(introductory paragraph) and (4) and to enact R.S. 37:3200(11) and
5	(12), 3207(A)(8), 3208.1, 3210(E), 3211.1, and 3212.1, relative to licensing of
6	radiology practitioner assistants; to provide for qualifications of radiology
7	practitioner assistants; to provide for licensing requirements for radiology
8	practitioner assistants; and to provide for related matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. R.S. 37:3200(2)(introductory paragraph), 3207(B)(1),
11	3208(A)(introductory paragraph), 3211, 3212, 3213, 3214(introductory paragraph), 3216,
12	3219(A)(introductory paragraph) and (4) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
13	37:3200(11) and (12), 3207(A)(8), 3208.1, 3210(E), 3211.1, and 3212.1 are hereby enacted
14	to read as follows:
15	CHAPTER 45. LICENSED RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGIST AND LICENSED
16	RADIOLOGY PRACTITIONER ASSISTANT
17	§3200. Definitions
18	As used in this Chapter:

20	(2) "License" means a certificate issued by the board authorizing the licensee
21	to use radioactive materials or equipment emitting or detecting ionizing radiation on
22	humans for diagnostic or therapeutic purposes in accordance with the provisions of

6	(b) A licensed radiology practitioner assistant may provide radiologic
7	diagnostic medical services under the supervision of a radiologist.

10	certified and registered with the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists and
11	who is credentialed to provide primary radiologic health care under the supervision

14	participating in the work of a radiology practitioner assistant.

1	A. An applicant for licensure pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter shall
2	verify by oath or affirmation that he is:
3	(1) At least eighteen years of age.
4	(2) Has successfully completed a four-year course of study in a secondary
5	school approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, passed
6	an approved equivalency test, or has graduated from a secondary school outside
7	Louisiana having comparable approval.
8	B. Each applicant for a license as a radiology practitioner assistant shall:
9	(1) Be registered with the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists.
10	(2) Possess valid and current certification in Advanced Cardiac Life Support.

17	The board shall issue a license to each applicant who has successfully passed
18	the board examination or has otherwise been qualified under pursuant to the
19	provisions of this Chapter and authorize the use of the title "Licensed Radiologic
20	Technologist".
21	§3211.1. Licensure of radiology practitioner assistants
22	The board shall issue a license to each applicant who is qualified pursuant to
23	the provisions of this Chapter and authorize the use of the title "Licensed Radiology
24	Practitioner Assistant".
25	§3212. Licensing of radiologic technologists by reciprocity

27	§3212.1. Licensing of radiology practitioner assistants by reciprocity
28	The board shall issue a license without examination to persons who are
29	licensed as radiology practitioner assistants under the laws of other states provided

1	that the standards under which they were licensed are at least as stringent as those
2	established by the board.
3	§3213. Necessity of license of radiologic technologists; prohibited acts

5	§3214. Licensure of radiologic technologists; persons exempt
6	The requirements of a <u>radiologic technologist</u> license shall not apply to:

8	§3216. Reinstatement of license
9	A radiologic technologist Every person whose license has lapsed and who has
10	ceased activities as a radiologic technologist in his profession for not more than five
11	years may have his license reinstated upon payment of the renewal fee as provided
12	for in R.S. 37:3218 and upon submission of evidence satisfactory to the board that
13	he has fulfilled continuing education requirements as promulgated by the board.

15	§3219. Discipline; causes for censure, reprimand, suspension or revocation of
16	license
17	A. The board may suspend or revoke any license to practice as a radiologic
18	technologist or a radiology practitioner assistant or censure, reprimand, or otherwise
19	discipline a licensee upon proof that the person:

21	(4) Has aided and abetted a person who is not a licensed radiologic
22	technologist or radiology practitioner assistant or otherwise authorized by this
23	Chapter to perform the duties of a license holder.

Abstract: Provides for licensure of radiology practitioner assistants.

Present law provides for a definition of "license".

<u>Proposed law</u> changes <u>present law</u> to provide that "license" means a certificate issued by the Radiologic Technology Board of Examiners ("board") authorizing the licensee to engage in practice as a radiologic technologist and radiology practitioner assistant.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides for the definitions of "radiology practitioner assistant" and "supervising radiologist".

<u>Proposed law</u> allows the board to examine, license, renew licenses of, and issue temporary working permits to duly qualified applicants for licensure as radiology practitioner assistants.

Present law allows the board to establish a code of ethics for radiologic technologists.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but includes radiology practitioner assistants.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that qualifications for a radiology practitioner assistant be as follows:

- (1) At least 18 years of age.
- (2) Has successfully completed a four-year course of study in a secondary school approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, passed an approved equivalency test, or have graduated from a secondary school outside Louisiana having comparable approval.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that each applicant for a license as a radiology practitioner assistant shall be registered with the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists and possess valid and current certification in Advanced Cardiac Life Support.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the board to issue a license to each applicant who is qualified and authorize the use of the title "Licensed Radiology Practitioner Assistant".

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the board to issue a license without examination to persons who are licensed as radiology practitioner assistants under the laws of other states provided that the standards under which they were licensed are at least as stringent as those established by the board.

<u>Present law</u> provides for discipline of radiologic technologist by the board.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but includes discipline of radiology practitioner assistants.
