MTR VEHICLE/DRIVER LIC: Provides relative to documentation of school attendance as a condition of driving privileges

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 32:431.1(E)(3), relative to school attendance as condition of
3 driving privileges; to provide for the length of time documentation of school
4 attendance remains valid; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 32:431.1(E)(3) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

7 §431.1. School attendance as condition of driving privileges; authorized local policy

11 (3) Documentation of the minor's compliance with Subsection B of this
12 Section shall be provided on a form developed by the Department of Education and
13 made available to all school boards, home school providers, and adult education
14 supervisors upon request to the Department of Education. Such documentation of
15 the minor's compliance with Subsection B of this Section shall be valid for a period
16 of ninety days from the date of issuance.

Abstract: Specifies the length of time documentation of school attendance is valid for purposes of a minor's driving privileges.

Present law provides no minor may be issued a driver's license or learner's permit for the operation of a motor vehicle unless, at the time of application, documentation is presented to the department that the minor is enrolled and is attending a school as defined herein.

Present law provides upon request of any minor who is enrolled and attending school and who is eligible to apply for a license, the appropriate authority shall provide to him a documentation form developed by the Dept. of Education and made available to all school boards, home school providers, and adult education supervisors, of his compliance.

Proposed law provides documentation of school attendance provided to the minor by the appropriate authority is valid for a period of 90 days from the date of issuance.
