R.S. 14:95.7(C) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 6 7 §95.7. Possession of or dealing in firearms with obliterated number numbers or 8 mark <u>marks</u> 9 10 C. Whoever violates the provisions of this Section shall be fined not more 11 than one thousand dollars and may be imprisoned for not more than six months. 12 imprisoned as follows: 13 (1) For a first offense, the penalty shall be imprisonment, with or without 14 hard labor, for not less than one year nor more than five years. 15 (2) For a second or subsequent offense, the penalty shall be imprisonment, 16 with or without hard labor, for not less than two years nor more than ten years.
