Limitation upon jury trials 9 A trial by jury shall not be available in: 10 (1) A suit where the amount of no individual petitioner's cause of action 11 exceeds fifty thousand dollars exclusive of interest and costs exceeds the amount in 12 controversy as set forth in the provisions of 28 U.S.C. 1332(a). 13

Abstract: Provides for access to jury trials when the amount in controversy exceeds \$75,000.

<u>Present law</u> (28 U.S.C. 1332(a)) provides for original jurisdiction of district courts for civil actions between diverse citizens, having an amount in controversy greater than \$75,000.

CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing law; words <u>underscored</u> are additions.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits certain suits from being tried before a jury, including suits where no individual petitioner's cause of action exceeds \$50,000.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and increases the threshold amount in controversy for access to a jury trial to \$75,000.
