1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 33:9097.13, relative to East Baton Rouge Parish; to create the Glen Oaks
3	Crime Prevention and Improvement District within the parish; to provide relative to
4	the purpose, boundaries, governance, and powers and duties of the district; to
5	provide for the imposition of a parcel fee and for the use thereof; and to provide for
6	related matters.
7	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published
8	as provided by Article III, Section 13 of the Constitution of
9	Louisiana.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 33:9097.13 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
12	§9097.13. Glen Oaks Crime Prevention and Improvement District
13	A. Creation. There is hereby created within the parish of East Baton Rouge,
14	as more specifically provided in Subsection B of this Section, a body politic and
15	corporate which shall be known as the Glen Oaks Crime Prevention and
16	Improvement District, referred to in this Section as the "district". The district shall
17	be a political subdivision of the state as defined in the Constitution of Louisiana.
18	B. Boundaries. The district shall include the area within the following
19	boundaries: beginning at the intersection of Greenwell Street and Silverleaf Avenue,
20	north along Silverleaf Avenue (both sides) then east along Silverleaf Avenue (both
21	sides) to its intersection with Mickens Road, then southeast along the west side of
22	Mickens Road to its intersection with Lanier Drive, then south along the west side
23	of Lanier Drive to its intersection with Greenwell Street, then west along the north
24	side of Greenwell Street to the point of beginning.

1	C. Purpose. The purposes of the district shall be to aid in crime prevention
2	by providing security for district residents and to serve the needs of the residents of
3	the district by funding beautification and improvements for the overall betterment
4	of the district.
5	D. Governance. (1) The district shall be governed by a board of
6	commissioners, referred to in this Section as the "board", consisting of members as
7	<u>follows:</u>
8	(a) Two members shall be appointed by the state representative for House
9	District Number 29.
10	(b) Two members shall be appointed by the state senator for Senate District
11	Number 15.
12	(c) One member shall be appointed by the member or members of the
13	governing authority of the parish of East Baton Rouge who represent the district.
14	(2) All members of the board shall be residents and qualified voters within
15	the district.
16	(3) Members of the board shall serve four-year terms after initial terms as
17	follows: two members shall serve an initial term of one year; one member shall
18	serve two years; one member shall serve three years; and one member shall serve
19	four years, as determined by lot at the first meeting of the board.
20	(4) Vacancies resulting from the expiration of a term or any other reason
21	shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the manner of the original
22	appointment. Members are eligible for reappointment.
23	(5) The members of the board shall select from among themselves a
24	president and such other officers as they deem appropriate. The responsibilities of
25	the officers shall be as provided by the bylaws of the board.
26	(6) The members of the board shall serve without compensation and shall not
27	receive reimbursement for expenses.
28	E. Powers and duties. The district, acting through its board of
29	commissioners, shall have the following powers and duties:
30	(1) To sue and be sued.

1	(2) To adopt, use, and alter at will a corporate seal.
2	(3) To receive and expend funds collected pursuant to Subsection F of this
3	Section and in accordance with a budget adopted as provided by Subsection G of this
4	Section.
5	(4) To enter into contracts with individuals or entities, private or public, for
6	the provision of security patrols in the district.
7	(5) To purchase items and supplies which the board deems instrumental to
8	achieving the purpose of the district.
9	(6) To perform or have performed any other function or activity necessary
10	for the achievement of the purpose of the district.
11	F. Parcel fee. The governing authority of East Baton Rouge Parish may
12	impose and collect a parcel fee within the district subject to and in accordance with
13	the provisions of this Subsection:
14	(1) The amount of the fee shall be as requested by duly adopted resolution
15	of the board. The fee, however, shall not exceed one hundred dollars per parcel per
16	year for lots zoned for residential use and five hundred dollars per year for lots zoned
17	for commercial use.
18	(2)(a) The fee shall be imposed on each improved parcel located within the
19	district.
20	(b) For purposes of this Section, "parcel" means a lot, a subdivided portion
21	of ground, or an individual tract and does not mean a "condominium parcel" as
22	defined in R.S. 9:1121.103. Thus, with respect to condominiums, the fee collector
23	shall impose the parcel fee on each lot on which condominiums are situated and not
24	on individual condominium units.
25	(c) The owner of the parcel shall be responsible for payment of the fee.
26	(3)(a) The fee shall be imposed only after the question of its imposition has
27	been approved by a majority of the registered voters of the district voting at an
28	election held for that purpose in accordance with the Louisiana Election Code. At
29	least thirty days prior to any election held to approve imposition of a parcel fee, the
30	board shall mail notification of the upcoming election to each registered voter of the

1	district and to the owner of each parcel if the owner is not a registered voter of the
2	district. No other election shall be required except as provided by this Paragraph.
3	(b) The initial election on the question of the imposition of the fee shall be
4	held at the same time as a regularly scheduled election in the parish of East Baton
5	Rouge.
6	(c) The fee shall expire eight years from its initial levy but may be renewed
7	as provided in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph. If the fee is renewed, the term of
8	the imposition of the fee shall be as provided in the proposition authorizing such
9	renewal, not to exceed eight years.
10	(4) The fee shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as ad
11	valorem taxes are collected within the parish.
12	(5) Any parcel fee shall be added to the tax rolls of the parish and shall be
13	enforced with the same authority and subject to the same penalties and procedures
14	as ad valorem taxes.
15	(6) The sheriff of the parish of East Baton Rouge shall remit to the district
16	all amounts collected not more than sixty days after collection; however, the board
17	may enter into an agreement with the sheriff to authorize the sheriff to retain a
18	collection fee.
19	G. Budget. (1) The board of commissioners shall adopt an annual budget
20	in accordance with the Louisiana Local Government Budget Act, R.S. 39:1301 et
21	<u>seq.</u>
22	(2) The district shall be subject to audit by the legislative auditor pursuant
23	to R.S. 24:513.
24	H. Miscellaneous provisions. (1) It is the purpose and intent of this Section
25	that the additional law enforcement personnel and services provided by the district
26	shall be supplemental to and not in lieu of personnel and services provided in the
27	district by the city of Baton Rouge and parish of East Baton Rouge.
28	(2) If the district ceases to exist, any funds of the district shall be transmitted
29	to the governing authority of the city of Baton Rouge and parish of East Baton

1 Rouge and shall be used for law enforcement purposes in the area included within 2 the district. 3 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 4 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 5 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 6 7 effective on the day following such approval.
