POLICE/MUNICIPAL: Exempts Mandeville from certain laws regarding wages and hours of police officers

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 33:2211(A), relative to the city of Mandeville; to provide that
3	laws governing employment of municipal police, including matters of compensation,
4	leave, and hours, do not apply to Mandeville; to provide relative to effectiveness; and
5	to provide for related matters.

9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. R.S. 33:2211(A) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
11	§2211. Applicability; definition of "employee of police department"
12	A.(1) The Except as provided in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection and as
13	otherwise specified in R.S. 33:2212.1, provisions of this Subpart shall apply to
14	municipalities having a population of not less than twelve thousand nor more than
15	two hundred fifty thousand; however,.
16	(2)(a) R.S. 33:2214 shall not apply to the city of Westwego.
17	(b) The provisions of this Subpart, including R.S. 33:2212.1, shall not apply
18	to the city of Mandeville.

Abstract: Exempts Mandeville from laws governing various aspects of employment of municipal police, including compensation, leave, and hours.

<u>Present law</u> governs several aspects of employment in municipal police departments in municipalities having a population of not less than 12,000 and not more than 250,000, including the following:

- (1) Setting minimum salaries for officers at various ranks. <u>Present law</u> also sets minimum salaries for police officers in municipalities with a population of not less than 7,000 and not more than 12,000.
- (2) Setting maximum weekly work hours and providing relative to compensation and compensatory time required for overtime worked.
- (3) Providing for the annual leave and sick leave to which officers are entitled.
- (4) Providing for holidays and compensation for work on holidays.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that <u>present law</u> does not apply to Mandeville.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that <u>proposed law</u> is to be given retroactive and prospective effect.
