BUDGETARY CONTROLS: Provides for an exception for certain information required to be submitted by a nongovernmental entity

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 39:51.1(B)(1), relative to nongovernmental entity funding
3 request forms; to exempt certain entities from providing certain information on the
4 request form; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 39:51.1(B)(1) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

7 §51.1. General Appropriation Bill and other appropriation bills; nongovernmental
8 entity funding request form; exemptions

9 * * *

10 B. Such information shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

11 (1) The entity's full legal name, mailing address, and physical address.

12 However, an entity that provides services to victims of domestic violence or human
13 trafficking shall be exempt from providing a physical address.

Abstract: Exempts as an entity that provides services to domestic violence or human trafficking victims from providing a physical address on the nongovernmental entity funding request form.

Present law requires a nongovernmental entity that is neither a budget unit nor a political subdivision of the state that is requesting funding from the state through the General Appropriation Bill, capital outlay bill, or any supplemental appropriation bill to submit certain information relative to the proposed funding to certain committees. Includes the physical address of the entity.

Present law requires the clerk of the House of Representatives and the secretary of the Senate to publish each completed form and make it available to the public via the Internet.

Proposed law exempts an entity that provides services to victims of domestic violence or human trafficking from providing a physical address.
