BOARDS/COMMISSIONS: Provides with respect to the Louisiana Council on the Provision of Governmental Services to Latin Americans

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 36:4(AA) and 917 and R.S. 49:1222 and 1223, relative to the
3	Latino Commission; to change the name of the council; to provide relative to its
4	powers and duties; to otherwise provide with respect to its purpose and operations;
5	and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 49:1222 and 1223 are hereby amended and reenacted to read as
8	follows:

13	§1222. Louisiana Council on the Provision of Governmental Services to Latin
14	Americans Latino Commission; creation; domicile; membership
15	A. The Louisiana Council on the Provision of Governmental Services to
16	Latin Americans The Latino Commission, hereafter referred to in this Chapter as the
17	"council commission", is hereby established in the executive branch of state
18	government in the office of the governor. The council commission is hereby
19	declared to be a body corporate and public, exercising public and essential
20	governmental functions. The domicile of the council commission shall be in the city
21	of New Orleans.

7	(5) The Police Jury Association of Louisiana shall appoint one member.
8	(6) Each of the following or his designee shall be a member:
9	(a) The executive director of the Louisiana Workforce Commission.

11	(c) The secretary of the Department of Heath and Hospitals.
12	(7) Puentes New Orleans shall appoint three members.

3	C. Members of the council commission shall be residents of this state. Each
4	member shall be a member of a registered business organization in this state and
5	actively engaging in business in this state as of the date of appointment.
6	D. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum.
7	E. The council commission shall annually elect a chairman and a vice
8	chairman and other officers as it deems appropriate from among its members. The
9	commission may appoint subcommittees in accordance with its bylaws.
10	F. The council commission shall meet hold regular meetings at least
11	quarterly and may meet shall hold special meetings upon the call of the chairman or
12	any three members.
13	G. Appointed members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing
14	authority.
15	H. The governor shall provide staff and administrative support to the council
16	commission.
17	§1223. Powers and duties
18	A. The council commission shall identify obstacles to the effective delivery
19	of governmental services by all service providers at all levels of government to Latin
20	Latino Americans, and the council commission shall propose methods for removing
21	those obstacles from such delivery of services and submit its proposals to the
22	appropriate governmental entity or entities. To this end the council commission
23	shall:
24	(1) Conduct public hearings at which it takes testimony from service
25	providers, citizens, and advocates who can speak to the needs of the Latin Latino
26	American community. Such public hearings shall be held at various locations
27	around the state so as to facilitate the broadest possible participation by recipients
28	and potential recipients of governmental services.

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1	(2) Request of and receive from staff assigned to it research of available data
2	and information pertinent to the delivery of governmental services to Latin Latino
3	Americans, which research may include investigation of efforts in other states to
4	deliver services to foreign born populations.

5 (3) Formally adopt specific recommendations for changes in the allocation 6 of funds and spending, statutory law, administrative rules, and agency policy, 7 procedure, and practice and submit such specific recommendations to the appropriate 8 governmental entity or entities. If the recommendation is made to any entity other 9 than the legislature, a copy thereof shall also be submitted to the presiding officers 10 of the legislature each of whom shall forward the copy to the standing committee 11 or committees of his respective house which have jurisdiction over the issue or 12 entity.

B. The council commission may solicit, accept, and expend funds for the
purposes provided in this Section.

15 <u>C. The commission may support the state's celebration of its bicentennial of</u>
 16 <u>statehood by holding or participating in programs and events through which it can</u>
 17 <u>increase public awareness of the significance of Latino American heritage, culture,</u>
 18 <u>and contributions throughout the state's history.</u>

 The Louisiana Council on the Provision of Governmental Services to Latin
 Americans Latino Commission is placed within the office of the governor and shall
 exercise its powers, duties, functions, and responsibilities as provided in this Part.
 In addition the board may solicit, receive, and expend funds as authorized by law.

### LaFonta

HB No. 768

Abstract: Changes the name of the La. Council on the Provision of Governmental Services to Latin Americans. Authorizes it to participate in the state's celebration of its bicentennial.

<u>Present law</u> creates the La. Council on the Provision of Governmental Services to Latin Americans. <u>Proposed law</u> changes the name of the council to the Latino Commission.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the composition of the council, which includes two members appointed by the president of the Senate, two members appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives, one member appointed by each of the following: the governor, the La. Municipal Association, and the Police Jury Association of La. Provides for numerous private groups and entities to designate members. Requires that the council identify obstacles to the effective delivery of governmental services by all service providers at all levels of government to Latino Americans and propose methods for removing those obstacles from such delivery of services and submit its proposals to the appropriate governmental entity or entities.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and additionally authorizes the commission to support the state's celebration of its bicentennial of statehood by holding or participating in programs and events through which it can increase public awareness of the significance of Latino American heritage, culture, and contributions throughout the state's history.

<u>Present law</u> provides for annual election of a chairman and a vice chairman. <u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the election of additional officers. Authorizes the commission to appoint subcommittees in accordance with its bylaws.

<u>Present law</u> requires the council to meet at least quarterly upon the call of the chairman or any three members. <u>Proposed law</u> requires regular meetings quarterly and authorizes special meetings upon the call of the chairman or any three members.
