COMMERCIAL REGS/ANTITRUST: Authorizes the state to bring an action in an antitrust matter

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 51:137, relative to antitrust; to authorize the state to bring an 3 action; and to provide for related matters. 4 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 5 Section 1. R.S. 51:137 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 6 §137. Damages recoverable for violation of law 7 A. Any person who is injured in his business or property by any person by 8 reason of any act or thing forbidden by this Part, regardless of whether such injured 9 person dealt directly or indirectly with the defendant, may sue in any court of 10 competent jurisdiction and shall recover threefold the damages sustained by him, the 11 cost of suit, and a reasonable attorney's attorney fee. 12 B. The state may bring an action on behalf of any person who is injured in 13 his business or property by any person by reason of any act or thing forbidden by this 14 Part, regardless of whether such injured person dealt directly or indirectly with the 15 defendant, in any court of competent jurisdiction and shall recover threefold the 16 damages sustained by him, the cost of suit, and a reasonable attorney fee.

Leger HB No. 813

Abstract: Authorizes the state to bring an action in an antitrust matter.

<u>Present law</u> authorizes any person who is injured in his business or property by any person by reason of any act or thing forbidden by <u>present law</u> to sue in any court of competent jurisdiction and to recover threefold the damages sustained by him, the cost of suit, and a reasonable attorney fee.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that the person may bring an action regardless of whether the injured person dealt directly or indirectly with the defendant.

<u>Proposed law</u> authorizes the state to bring an action on behalf of any person who is injured in his business or property by any person by reason of any act or thing forbidden by <u>proposed law</u>, regardless of whether such injured person dealt directly or indirectly with the defendant, in any court of competent jurisdiction and to recover threefold the damages sustained by him, the cost of suit, and a reasonable attorney fee.
