6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated from the sources specified
8	and in the amounts specified for the purpose of making supplemental appropriations for
9	Fiscal Year 2015-2016.

12 13 14	Payable out of Federal Funds to the Medical Vendor Administration Program for system modernization \$ 32,931,786
15 16 17	Payable out of Federal Funds to the Medical Vendor Administration Program for the Coordinated System of Care (CSoC) \$ 23,686,320
18	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
19	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
20	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
21	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
22	effective on the day following such approval.
