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HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 209

BESE: Directs BESE to submit a report relative to the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program to the legislature and the governor prior to the 2012 R.S.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	To direct the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to submit a report relative
3	to the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program to the legislature
4	and the governor prior to the convening of the 2012 Regular Session of the
5	Legislature of Louisiana.
6	WHEREAS, the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program was
7	established by Act No. 509 of the 2008 Regular Session of the Legislature; and
8	WHEREAS, the legislature found and declared that it is in the public interest that all
9	Louisiana school children receive the best education that its citizens can provide, and the
10	state of Louisiana has the right, responsibility, duty, and obligation to accomplish the
11	objective of quality education for all Louisiana children, particularly for those children in
12	school systems that have been declared to be academically in crisis; and
13	WHEREAS, the legislature further found and declared that nonpublic schools can
14	offer a quality education to students that are academically in crisis, and it is in the public
15	interest to offer students in such systems the means of accessing the educational
16	opportunities offered by nonpublic schools by providing them with scholarships to attend
17	such schools; and
18	WHEREAS, the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program began
19	serving students in grades kindergarten through third grade, and one grade level has been
20	added each year resulting in students in grades kindergarten through sixth grade being served
21	during the 2011-2012 school year; and

WHEREAS, students must meet residency and family income requirements in order
to be eligible for the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program, and unless
entering kindergarten, must transfer from a failing school classified as Academically
Unacceptable pursuant to the state's accountability program; and
WHEREAS, the legislature has supported children through the Student Scholarships
for Educational Excellence Program by making annual appropriations since 2008; and
WHEREAS, the average scholarship amount of four thousand five hundred ninety-
five dollars is less than the Minimum Foundation Program per pupil amount of seven
thousand five hundred sixty-two dollars, thereby resulting in a substantial savings to
taxpayers; and
WHEREAS, hundreds of students in grades kindergarten through fifth have been
served through the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program, with over one
thousand eight hundred fifty to be served during the 2011-2012 school year; and
WHEREAS, demand for the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence
Program has continued to increase, with new students applying to the program each year,
students being placed on waiting lists each year, and a vast majority of enrolled students
continuing in the program; and
WHEREAS, ninety-three percent of parents and guardians of students enrolled in the
Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program expressed satisfaction with the
program through a parent survey in the fall of 2010; and
WHEREAS, approximately thirty percent of students enrolled in the Student
Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program have participated in the Louisiana
Educational Assessment Program, all of whom transferred from Academically Unacceptable
public schools; and
WHEREAS, many of the tested students have demonstrated improvement in
academic achievement as evidenced by the growing percentage of students who scored basic
and above in the Louisiana Educational Assessment Program; on average, their performance
remains below the average scores of students enrolled in the Recovery School District-New
Orleans, which includes both Academically Acceptable and Academically Unacceptable
schools; and

WHEREAS, the state Department of Education has worked with nonpublic schools
participating in the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program to review
student test scores, identify areas of weakness, and make resources available to aid in
curriculum alignment, remediation and student support, and test preparation; and
WHEREAS, participating nonpublic schools are currently developing plans to align
curricula with state content standards and the Louisiana Educational Assessment Program,
as well as to deliver targeted assistance and support to students receiving scholarships; and
WHEREAS, participating nonpublic schools have demonstrated their commitment
to increasing the academic achievement of all students enrolled in the Student Scholarships
for Educational Excellence Program during the 2011-2012 school year; and
WHEREAS, the first kindergarten students who enrolled in the Student Scholarships
for Educational Excellence Program in 2008 will participate in the Louisiana Educational
Assessment Program for the first time in the 2011-2012 school year as third graders, thereby
providing the state with academic achievement data on the first cohort of students who have
had the full benefit of this program; and
WHEREAS, current law, R.S. 17:4024, requires the state Department of Education
annually to report to the House Committee on Education, the Senate Committee on
Education, and the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget regarding the implementation
of the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program, including the number of
eligible students receiving scholarships, a list of participating schools and the number of
scholarship recipients each such school enrolled, and aggregate test result data for the
scholarship recipients enrolled in each participating school; and
WHEREAS, it is essential that the legislature, the governor, and the taxpayers
receive information with which they can evaluate the impact and effectiveness of state-
supported programs in order to hold such programs accountable for desired outcomes; and
WHEREAS, parental choice educational programs are best implemented when
parents and guardians receive information and evidence, including evidence relative to other
public education options, on which to base decisions impacting their children's education.

1 to the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence Program to the legislature and the 2 governor prior to the convening of the 2012 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana. 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such report shall include the following 4 information: 5 (1) An accounting of funds spent on the Student Scholarship for Educational 6 Excellence Program during Fiscal Year 2012. 7 (2) Student enrollment data for each participating nonpublic school, including data 8 for each grade level served. 9 (3) A detailed summary of the academic achievement of students enrolled in tested 10 grades during the 2011-2012 school year, aggregated by participating nonpublic schools and 11 compared to the academic achievement of students enrolled in similar grades in Recovery 12 School District schools in Orleans Parish. 13 (4) Parent survey data on their satisfaction with their child's school and the program 14 overall. 15 Recommendations to improve the academic achievement of scholarship 16 recipients, communication with parents and guardians about the performance of participating 17 nonpublic schools as measured by the Louisiana Educational Assessment Program, and 18 overall program quality. 19 (6) Any other item jointly agreed upon by the House Committee on Education and 20 the Senate Committee on Education prior to October 1, 2011. 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a suitable copy of this Resolution be transmitted 22 to the governor, the president of the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, 23 the state superintendent of education, and the principal or headmaster and the governing 24 authority of each nonpublic school participating in the Student Scholarships for Educational

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Excellence Program.
