A RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Bishop Ellis matriculated at The College of The Bahamas in Nassau, Bahamas, and holds an honorary doctorate of divinity degree from both St. Thomas Christian College in Jacksonville, Florida, and Virginia Theological Seminary and College in Alexandria, Virginia; he is also the recipient of an honorary doctor of humane letters from Sojourner-Douglass College in Baltimore, Maryland; he earned his doctorate in covenant leadership from New Covenant University in St. Augustine, Florida; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Ellis is a much sought-after preacher and to date has preached throughout the Bahamas, in various Caribbean countries, in North America, Germany, Africa, and Israel; he is the author of twelve practical books; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Ellis is married to the former Patrice Michelle Johnson and they along with their children reside in Nassau, Bahamas; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Ellis and his wife Patrice organized Mount Tabor Union Baptist Church in February of 1987; now known as Mount Tabor Church, it is one of the fastest growing churches in The Bahamas; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Ellis has been involved in the Full Gospel Baptist Church Fellowship International since its inception; on May 3, 1995, he was consecrated as bishop of foreign ministries by the fellowship; and

WHEREAS, Bishop Ellis's diligence and commitment to the fellowship has resulted in his serving in numerous capacities; he has served as the first regional bishop for the Bahamas, the first bishop of foreign ministry, the first chairman of the College of Bishops; as first assistant to the international presiding bishop and third international presiding bishop; and
