12	D. In the City Court of Baton Rouge and the City Court of Houma, the civil
13	jurisdiction is concurrent with the district court in cases where the amount in dispute,
14	or the value of the property involved, does not exceed twenty thousand dollars.
15	E. In the City Court of Abbeville, the City Court of Baker, the City Court of
16	Bogalusa, the City Court of Bunkie, the City Court of Eunice, the City Court of
17	Kaplan, the City Court of Lake Charles, the City Court of Marksville, the City Court
18	of Monroe, the City Court of Natchitoches, a city court in New Orleans, the City
19	Court of Opelousas, the City Court of Plaquemine, the City Court of Port Allen, the
20	City Court of Ruston, the City Court of Shreveport, the City Court of Sulphur, the
21	City Court of Winnsboro, and the City Court of Zachary, the civil jurisdiction is
22	concurrent with the district court in cases where the amount in dispute, or the value

1 of the property involved, does not exceed twenty-five thousand dollars. 2 F. In the City Court of Hammond, the City Court of Jennings, and the City 3 Court of Monroe, the City Court of Oakdale, and the City Court of Winnfield the 4 civil jurisdiction is concurrent with the district court in cases where the amount in 5 dispute, or the value of the property involved, does not exceed thirty thousand dollars. 6 7 G.
