STATE POLICE RET FUND. Relative to benefits for members of the State Police Retirement System. (6/30/12)

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 11:1305(A)(1), (C)(1) and (2), 1307(A)(1) and (2)(b), (B), and
3	(D)(1), 1345.3, 1345.4(introductory paragraph), (A), (B), and (C), and 1345.5,
4	relative to the State Police Pension and Retirement System; to provide relative to
5	membership, contributions, eligibility for and calculation of benefits; to provide for
6	an effective date; and to provide for related matters.
7	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S.11:1305(A)(1), (C)(1) and (2), 1307(A)(1) and (2)(b), (B), and (D)(1),
10	1345.3, 1345.4(introductory paragraph), (A), (B) and (C), and 1345.5 are hereby amended
11	and reenacted to read as follows:
12	§1305. Membership in pension and retirement system; credit for unclassified
13	service prohibited; exceptions
14	A. Membership in the State Police Pension and Retirement System shall
15	consist of the following:
16	(1) Sworn, commissioned law enforcement officers of the office of state
17	police of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections who have satisfactorily

1 completed the State Police Training Academy Course of Instruction, as provided by 2 pursuant to Act No. 320 of the 1975 Louisiana Legislature and Act No. 94 of the 3 1936 Louisiana Legislature, except those employed under the provisions of R.S. 40:1388 and 1389, who were in the employ of the former division of state police on 4 5 the date of establishment of this system or who are subsequently employed or who were employed and left on deposit the amount paid into the system, and sworn 6 commissioned law enforcement officers of the office of state police who were 7 8 transferred to other offices of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections 9 pursuant to the Executive Reorganization Act prior to January 1, 1979. 10 11 C.(1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, and particularly 12 R.S. 11:1307 or any other provision of this Section, any state police employee who 13 is a sworn, commissioned law enforcement officer of the office of state police, who serves in an active capacity in an unclassified position in the Department of Public 14 Safety and Corrections, and who has previously contributed to this system, shall be 15 16 eligible to continue contributing and accruing **creditable** service <del>credit</del> in this 17 system. (2) Any employee described in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection shall be 18 19 entitled to have his or her salary earned in such unclassified capacity included in the calculation of retirement benefits which accrue to the employee under this system. 20 21 §1307. Persons eligible to retire on basis of service and age; retirement benefits 22 A. Upon application to the board as provided in R.S. 11:1306, members of 23 24 this system shall be retired by the board at benefits fixed as follows: (1) Any member of the system, whose first employment making him or her 25 eligible for membership in one of the state systems occurred on or before December 26 27 31, 2010, and who has attained age fifty and who has credit for at least ten years of service shall be paid a monthly benefit equal to the sum of three and one-third 28 29 percent multiplied by the member's monthly average salary, and further multiplied

1	by the number of years of service credited to the member's account, but the total
2	annual benefit shall not exceed one hundred percent of the member's final average
3	annual salary.
4	(2) * * *
5	(b) Any member of the system whose initial date of employment occurred on
6	or after September 8, 1978, and whose first employment making him or her eligible
7	for membership in one of the state systems occurred on or before December 31,
8	2010, who has credit for at least twenty-five years of service, regardless of age, shall
9	be paid a monthly benefit equal to the sum of three and one-third percent multiplied
10	by the member's monthly average salary, and further multiplied by the number of
11	years of service credited to the member's account, but the total annual benefit shall
12	not exceed one hundred percent of the member's final average annual salary.
13	* * *
14	B. Any member of the system who is a commissioned member of the office
15	of state police who has at least twenty years of active service and who retires under
16	the provisions of this Section shall be entitled to purchase his or her firearm at fair
17	market value, upon retirement, subject to the approval of the deputy secretary of
18	public safety services of the department.
19	* * *
20	D.(1) Regardless of the compensation actually paid to a member, retirement
21	benefits from the State Police Pension and Retirement System shall be as provided
22	in this Chapter, except that his or her retirement benefits shall not exceed the
23	amount he would receive, assuming for computation purposes his or her earnings
24	were equal to the highest step of the pay range for the highest classified position in
25	the office of state police. The member's contributions shall be based upon the above
26	salary assumed for computation purposes.

28	§1345.3. Eligibility for membership
29	Each person who would be eligible for system membership pursuant to R.S.

1	11:1305 but whose first employment making him <u>or her</u> eligible for membership in
2	one of the state systems occurred on or after January 1, 2011, shall become a
3	member of the New State Police Retirement Plan of the system as a condition of
4	employment.
5	* * *
6	§1345.4. Eligibility for retirement
7	Any member shall be eligible for retirement if he or she has:
8	A. Twenty-five years or more of service <b><u>credit</u></b> , at any age.
9	B. Twelve years or more of service <b>credit</b> , at age fifty-five or thereafter.
10	C. Twenty years of service credit at any age, exclusive of military service
11	and unused annual and sick leave, but any person retiring under this Subsection shall
12	have his <u>or her</u> benefit, inclusive of military service credit and allowable unused
13	annual and sick leave, actuarially reduced from the earliest age that he would
14	normally become eligible for a regular retirement benefit under Subsection A or B
15	of this Section if he had continued in service to that age. Any employee who elects
16	to retire under the provisions of this Subsection shall not be eligible to participate in
17	the Back-Deferred Retirement Option Program provided by R.S. 11:1312.1 or the
18	Initial Benefit Option provided by R.S. 11:1307(E).

20	§1345.5. Retirement benefit
21	A member shall receive a retirement equal to three and one-third percent of
22	average compensation for every each year of creditable service in the plan, not to
23	exceed one hundred percent of the member's average compensation.
24	* * *
25	Section 2. This Act shall become effective on June 30, 2012; if vetoed by the
26	governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on

June 30, 2012, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.
