AN ACT
To amend and reenact R.S. 17:221(I) and R.S. 36:649(D), to enact R.S. 17:1871(B)(8) and
3217.1(D), and to repeal R.S. 17:14, relative to adult education; to provide for the
school attendance of certain students in adult education programs; to eliminate the
division of adult and community education within the Department of Education; to
transfer the responsibility for the provision of adult education programs from the
State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education to the Board of Supervisors for
Community and Technical Colleges and to provide with respect thereto; to provide
for the powers, duties, and functions of the Board of Supervisors of Community and
Technical Colleges; to provide for an effective date of such transfer; and to provide
for related matters.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
Section 1. R.S. 17:221(I) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 17:1871(B)(8)
and 3217.1(D) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
§221. School attendance; compulsory ages; duty of parents; excessive absences;
consent to withdraw; condition for driving privileges
* * *
I. Nothing in this Section shall prohibit a child who is at least sixteen years
of age and, who meets criteria established by the State Board of Elementary and

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1	Secondary Education for enrolling in an effective adult education program, that is
2	approved by the board from enrolling in and attending such a program. A parent,
3	tutor, or other person responsible for the school attendance of a child who is at least
4	sixteen years of age but under age eighteen and who is enrolled in and is fulfilling
5	the attendance requirements of an adult education program that is approved by the
6	board shall be considered to be in compliance with the school attendance provisions
7	of Paragraph (A)(1) of this Section. <u>As used in this Subsection, an ''effective adult</u>
8	education program" means an approved program that has demonstrated a
9	proven record of student progress in the attainment of basic skills and essential
10	competencies as determined by quality indicators and performance-based
11	<u>criteria developed and adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Community and</u>
12	Technical Colleges in accordance with R.S. 17:3217.1(D)(2).

19	(8) Beginning July 1, 2010 and thereafter, establish, operate, and
20	maintain a statewide adult education program and adopt such regulations as
21	may be necessary for the provision of such program.

23	§3217.1. Louisiana Community and Technical Colleges system College System

25	D.(1) Beginning July 1, 2010 and thereafter, the board of supervisors
26	shall:
27	(a) Adopt such rules and regulations as are necessary to establish,
28	operate, and maintain a statewide program of adult education to eliminate adult
29	illiteracy and to provide opportunities for adults to pursue a course or courses
30	of study which upon completion will entitle them to be issued a Louisiana high
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1	school equivalency diploma.
2	(b) Fully fund the cost of a statewide adult education program and shall
3	allocate such funds appropriated therefor based on an adopted formula.
4	(2) Each program of adult education shall meet eligibility criteria
5	established and adopted by the board and be subject to the overall
6	administration and supervision provided by this Subsection. Quality indicators
7	and performance-based criteria, as established and adopted by the board, shall
8	be used to allocate funds on an annual basis.

10	Section 2. R.S. 36:649(D) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
11	§649. Offices; purposes and functions relating to elementary and secondary
12	education

14	D. The office of school and community support shall perform the functions
15	of the state relating to student, school, and community health and nutrition programs,
16	and transportation, community adult training programs, and postsecondary and
17	workforce development programs, all in accordance with applicable law.
18	Section 3. R.S. 17:14 is hereby repealed.
19	Section 4. The Board of Supervisors of Community and Technical Colleges shall
20	succeed the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education as the supervising and
21	managing board for adult education programs in Louisiana. The adult education content
22	standards and benchmarks set forth in the Louisiana Administrative Code, Title 28, Part
23	CXXIX by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, shall be deemed to be
24	the adult education content standards and benchmarks of the Louisiana Community and
25	Technical College System on July 1, 2010 and thereafter for the purposes of R.S.
26	17:3217.1(D), until such time as the Board of Supervisors of Community and Technical
27	Colleges promulgates rules and regulations in accordance with Administrative Procedure Act
28	regarding the same, to ensure a smooth transition in effectuating and implementing the
29	provisions of this Act.
30	Section 5. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2010; if vetoed by the governor

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- 1 and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1,
- 2 2010, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.
